In the meantime she will be well cared for in the city. The youngster is only thirteen years of age.

TIMMINS BOARD OF TRADE MEETING THIS EVENING

Important Business to be Dealt With at Meeting in the Grill Room of the Empire Hotel.

A meeting of the Timmins Board of Trade has been called by the president, Dr. J. A. McInnis to be held this (Thursday) evening, June 2nd, in the Grill Room of the Empire Hotel, at 8 p.m. Several important matters are to be dealt with, and a large attendance of members of the Board of Trade and other interested citizens is desired. One of the special matters to be up for discussion will be the proposed trip to Toronto by motor over the new North Land highway, when completed this fall. From this trip it is believed that the North will receive much valuable publicity, as well as those taking part on the motor trip enjoying a very interesting and pleasing time. There will also be plans necessary for the entertainment of the party from Florida to be brought here by motor over the new road. This party will be under the direction of Dr. Doolittle, the noted Good Roads man, and will likely visit Timmins in the early days of September.

Other important questions, relative to general matters in the town and district will also be before the Board of Trade, and the meeting in the Grill Room of the Empire Hotel this evening at 8 o'clock should be a busy and profitable one, if a good attendance of business men and others turn out, as they certainly should.

SEES GREAT CHANGES IN TIMMINS IN TEN YEARS

Mr. Palangio, of Cochrane, a noted hockey player years ago in this district, motored down from Cochrane this week on a visit to Timmins. It is nearly eleven years since he was last in Timmins and he sees wonderful changes in the town. On his last visit here, Timmins had only one brick building, and there was hardly a structure that could be called anything like fire-proof. Now there are literally scores of brick buildings and the buildings are gradually all getting into the fire-proof class. Instead of a town of five or six thousand people, he sees a regular city of fourteen or fifteen thousand, with sewers, water system, paved roads, and all other modern conveniences and advantages. "Timmins has certainly grown and prospered since I saw it last," said Mr. Palangio.

On the other hand, Mr. Palangio is an enthusiast about Cochrane to prosper and advance in noteworthy way. Mr. Palangio has backed his faith with his money, being interested in a hotel, a restaurant, a theatre and a garage business in Cochrane.

Mr. Palangio reports the road from Cochrane to Timmins as being in very good shape. With this good motor route in view he said:—"I have not been in Timmin before since 1916, but now I hope to take comparatively frequent trips to the big town."
