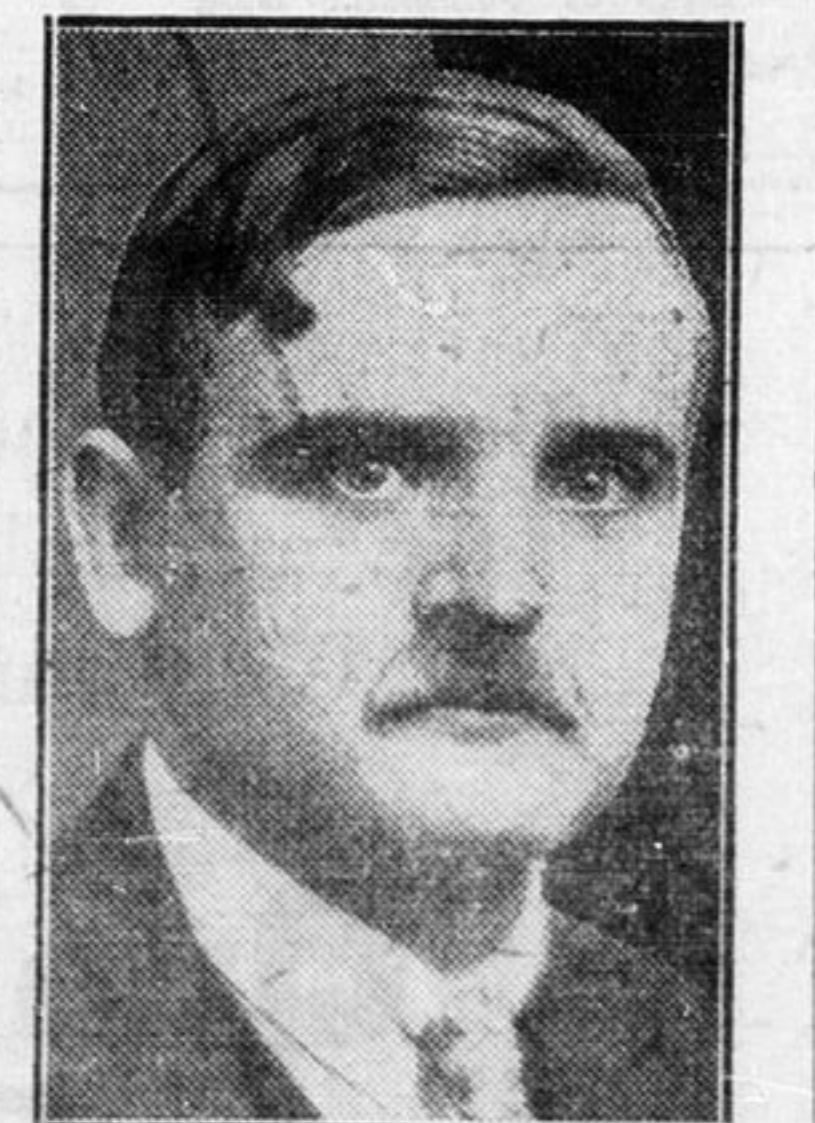

Some progress has been made in negotiations, but the outcome is still understood to be uncertain. The names of Consolidated West Dome Lake as well as Preston East Dome and possibly Goldale claims are mentioned as being among the groups which the advocates of a merger would like to consolidate. Possible benefits of such a consolidation are difficult to see at this time, the location of the various properties not holding out any particular prospect of one being of benefit to another. Each group appears to have its prospects more or less separate and distinct from the other.
