## CANADA THIS YEAR

Ottawa, Canada.-This year's commercial apple crop in Canada will total, according to a recent official esti- 1927. mate, 3,482,000 barrels or about 500,000 barrels more than the 1926 crop. Nova Scotia will produce, it is estimated, 1,400,000 barrels this year, an increase of 473,000 barrels over last year; Ontario's crop will be 900,000 barrels, more than 300,000 barrels over the 1926 crop. British Columbia's production this year will be 1,049,000 barrels, which is over 260,000 barrels less than last year. Quebec's crop will be 103,000 barrels, 13,000 less than a year ago and New Brunswick will produce 30,000 barrels, the same as in 1926.

Canadian growers are again preparing to make many entries in the competitive displays at the Imperial Fruit Show to be held in Manchester, England, next October. For several years Canada has won the highest awards with the McIntosh Red apple as the best dessert apple grown in the British Empire. This variety was originated in Dundas County, Ontario. quite close to Ottawa.

Canadian apples find, because of their enviable quality and flavour, a ready market in the British Isles and the United States. Great Britain is the principal export market to where hundreds of thousands of barrels are shipped annually.


