Junior Hockey Organized in Timmins for the Season

Officers Elected and Prospects Good for Coming Season's Hockey. To be Strictly "Home Brew." North Bay and Sudbury Following Same Lines This Year.

There was a fairly good attendance at the meeting called in the fire hall on Thursday evening last, Aug. 11th, for the organization for Junior hockey in Timmins for the season.

Honorary presidents—J. H. Knox, C. G. Williams, R. J. Ennis, Rev. J. D. Parks and Rev. Fr. O'Gorman.

Honorary vice-presidents—Mayor E. L. Longmore, Dr. J. E. I. Joyal, Dr. J. A. McInnis, Fire Chief Borland, President—R. D. Parker.

First vice-president—C. G. Keddie. Second vice-president—R. E. Dye. Secretary-treasurer—P. T. Moisleley. Executive committee—W. G. Smith, W. D. McIntyre, and one to be appointed from the players.

Coach—J. Scully. Trainers—A. Hunter and W. G. McHugh, Jr.

One matter that was agreed upon was that Junior hockey here this season will be a strictly "home brew" affair. No players have been imported and none are to be brought in.

It is believed that there is enough talent in the line of hockey already in the town and district to assure a first-class hockey team, and on this belief

the hockey enthusiasts are prepared to stand or fall. Of course, Timmins Juniors will enter the N.O.H.A., and whether or not they win out they expect to have a good season's sport, which is the big thing. It may be noted that both North Bay and Sudbury this year are following the same plan as that adopted by Timmins and these towns in the N.O.H.A. Juniors are not importing any players.

TWO BURGLARIES IN TOWN ON SUNDAY EVENING

Two burglaries were committed in town Sunday evening. The shop of Mr. S. Seguin at 3 Cedar street north was entered by the criminal pulling off boards from the back window.

The other burglary was at Raphael's store, 17 1/2 Wilson avenue, where two bolts cloth and an overcoat were stolen. Entry was gained by smashing one of the windows at the rear of the building.

The police are working on the cases and it is hoped the guilty will be brought to justice for their sneaking-thieving work.

EMPIRE MINING CONGRESS TO BE NOTABLE EVENT

Delegates from All Over the World will be in Party Visiting Timmins End of This Month

The second (triennial) Empire Mining and Metallurgical Congress will meet in various parts of Canada and in Newfoundland, from August 22nd to September 28th. The Toronto meeting will be held on August 25th and 26th.

Representatives of institutes in South Africa, Australia, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Federated Malay States, France, Great Britain, India, Korea, Portugal, Russia, Spain, the United States, Tasmania, Gold Coast, Germany, Egypt, Sweden, and other countries, will, between the above dates, visit the principal mining centres of Ontario, Quebec, Western Canada, Eastern Canada, and Newfoundland.

Arriving in Toronto on Thursday, Aug. 25, the delegates will immediately go to the Hart House for breakfast, following which, under the chairmanship of Dr. A. P. Coleman, Emeritus, dean of the faculty of applied science and professor of geology, University

of Toronto, they will hold the inaugural session of the Toronto meeting in the Mining Building. The delegates will be addressed by His Honour W. D. Ross, Lieut.-Governor of Ontario, and Mayor Foster. The afternoons and evenings of the Congress are devoted to recreation, sight-seeing and social functions.

Leaving Toronto on Friday for Hamilton, Niagara Falls and Port Colborne, the delegates will be back in the city on Saturday, Aug. 27, when their special trains will be placed on the Exhibition siding. The delegates and their guests will be admitted to the Exhibition free of charge.

The delegates will reach Timmins at 8 p.m. on August 31st, remaining here until 5 p.m. on Sept. 1st, when they leave for Cochrane where they will divide into two sections to visit the other mining areas of Canada.

"SHORTY" GREEN MANAGER OF NEW YORK AMERICANS

"Shorty" Green, formerly of Sudbury, and well-known here where he visited only a few weeks ago, has been appointed coach of the New York Americans.
