

# 300 Cars and 1200 People to Go to Toronto on Big Crusade

286 Cars and 1107 Registered Last Sunday for the Trip. Official Programme Issued by J. J. Gibbons for the Crusade. Message Received from the Premier.

On Sunday, Aug. 28th, there had been registered for the Northern Ontario Crusade, 286 cars, with 1,107 people. As other cars are coming in, it is expected that the number going will reach 300 cars and 1,200 people.

Providing there is good weather, this crusade will be the biggest event that ever happened as far as Northern Ontario is concerned. The arrangements in Toronto are simply wonderful. To begin with, through the courtesy of the J. J. Gibbons Co., an official programme has been issued, which is a real work of art. The cover design shows a fishing scene in Northern Ontario water.
