**Kapuskasing Another of the Wonder Towns of the North**

**A Town of Unusual Natural Beauty and Attraction. Has Made Remarkable Progress in Last Year or Two. Spruce Falls Co. Turning it into a City of Homes and Progress. Great Prospects for the Future in This Budding City of the North.**

During the past year or two no town in this developing North Land has made the remarkable progress shown by the town of Kapuskasing. To-day Kapuskasing has a population of between three and four thousand people, with prosperity and progress evident on every hand, and with the prospects for the immediate future even brighter. Kapuskasing, like the Gaul described by Julius Caesar, may be divided into three parts. One part is the old commercial section, largely composed of hotels, rooming houses, cafes, and stores of various kinds, in close proximity to the Canadian National Railway station. This part is far outshone by the "Circle" in the second part of the town. The streets in this latter section run into a wide circle in the centre of which is a park space, well-built and attractive stores lining the circle. Among the progressive stores on this circle is the extensive premises of the Kapuskasing Supply Co., a departmental store that would not need to make apologies for itself or its large and up-to-date stocks in a city of five times the population of Kapuskasing. Last week the Kapuskasing Supply Co. store was a special centre of attraction, Mr. J. E. Stewart, of the Stewart Company, of Timmings, having a display there of the very latest in ladies' dresses, coats and fur coats.

The streets running out from the circle have also stores of progressive type, with practically all lines represented. There are also offices for doctors, dentists, lawyers, insurance and real estate men, banks and nearly every other line of use and value to the public. Dr. J. B. Aiken, formerly of Timmings, has a prosperous dental practice. Mr. W. F. Richardson, also formerly representative at Timmings for the North American Life Insurance Co., is the district agent at Kapuskasing for the same company. One of the attractive drug stores in the "Circle" is the Reid pharmacy, owned by a member of the Frank M. Burke staff at Timmings in earlier days. In view of the reputation given to many drug stores, it is interesting to note what one old-timer of Kapuskasing said about the Reid Drug Store "It's a real drug store," he commented, "where they sell drugs and give good service, but where there has never been a drop of liquor sold except legally on prescription, and where everything is conducted just right."

The third part of Kapuskasing is the beautiful residential section being built up by the Spruce Falls Pulp & Paper Co. This is the particular beauty part of the town of Kapuskasing. The lawns are not yet completed, and the work of construction being still in progress is of course a handicap to perfect appearance, but when this part of Kapuskasing is ready it will give Iroquois Falls the only run that town ever had for the honour of the name of the most beautiful town of the North. The houses are on large lots, are of most attractive design and each has an individuality of its own. The artistic way in which all these homes are painted adds much to their attractiveness. A visitor from Timmings looking on the pleasing array of homes, painted in such workmanlike and artistic way might be inclined to say they must have that old-timer, Ed. Leslie, here. That would be right. Ed. is in charge of the painting and decorating for the Spruce Falls Pulp & Paper Co., and of course is doing the best of work. He is one of the most popular and most-widely known of the citizens of new Kapuskasing. He has to lift his hat about as often as that other royal Ed., the Prince of Wales.

The whole town of Kapuskasing is supplied with waterworks and sewers. The work of installation of these services has been rushed. Steam shovels and a mechanical digger have done great work along this line. The latter is a wonderful machine in action, just walking along and digging the trench the desired length; the workmen hurrying behind and putting in the pipes, while the digger then turns around and fills it all in again. The work, however, does not make for good roads, and the soil being clay the visitor is impressed by the mud, as well as the mud being impressed by the visitor. The company intend to put in good roads throughout the town, as soon as the construction work is completed. Then Kapuskasing will be a great town. At present there are literally miles of good board walks, all the streets being well supplied in this regard.

A telephone line is being constructed at present from Cochrane to Kapuskasing by the T. & N.O. Railway and when this is completed it is likely that Kapuskasing will have local as well as long distance service.

Kapuskasing is greatly blessed by nature in its location and surroundings. The Spruce Falls Co. have made it an ideal site for a town. There is a wonderful natural park with long slopes down to the river in a basin-like bay. This park stretches along for over half a mile in a half-circle. It is to-day a wonderful beauty spot and will be still more beautiful as time passes. The company has aided nature, and now the park has wide pathways, flanked with great stretches of green lawn kept well-trimmed and neat, and with trees, shrubs and charming beds of flowers to give variety and interest.

At present Kapuskasing seems to be a town of hotels, boarding houses, rooming houses, cafes and restaurants. There are so many of these that they can not be counted. Usually that would mean that there was not a decent place to stop, but in the case of Kapuskasing that is not so. There are some good hotels, that are neat, clean and give good service. The Radio Hotel, the London, and the Empire are three that might be mentioned. But there is on the way now a hotel that will put them all in the shades. It is the 300-room one being erected by the Spruce Falls company to serve the big new paper town. There are two storeys and basement now up, and another two storeys to complete. It is of brick and steel construction, the most modern and up-to-date. It sits on the crest of a hill and will be an imposing structure. The magnificent Empire Hotel, at Timmings, "the pride of the North," will be overshadowed by the monster modern hotel at Kapuskasing. Hill-Clark-Francis of Timmings and New Liskeard, have the contract for this big structure. They also have the contract for 75 new houses in Kapuskasing and for other structures there. The hospital to be built by the company is to be another up-to-date and extensive building, replacing the two smaller hospitals now in use, and which are under the direction of Dr. Wright.

Kapuskasing is well supplied with churches and its schools are particularly noteworthy. The Separate school, a fine brick structure is excelled by the big 12-room modern school structure being completed now for the public school pupils. In the way of amusement and sports, Kapuskasing has been well looked after. The present club house, with its fine dance hall and motion picture house its rooms for athletics, reading room, bowling alleys and other features, is very complete, but is to be replaced by a bigger and better one. There is a fine baseball diamond, a football field, tennis courts, etc. There are enough Scotsmen that there will likely soon be a regular golf course and a curling rink. Mr. Alexander, one of the big business men of the town, is planning the building of a big motion picture house next year. The industry of the town is the Spruce Falls Pulp and Paper Co., at present producing about 160 tons of sulphite pulp a day. Work is under way in the erection of the most modern type of paper mill. The cornerstone of this great steel and cement structure will be formally laid in the course of a few days, with Premier

Ferguson, Hon. W. Finlayson, Mr. Geo. W. Lee and other public men of the province present. The present sulphite mill is one of the most modern and complete in use to-day. The machine shop in connection with it is a particular source of pride, being admitted by experts to be the most complete and up-to-date in the North Land, and equal to that of any paper mill anywhere. The rest of the plant is up to the same high standards. Two stacks towering 225 feet high give indication of the importance of the plant. When the new mill is ready next August, it will produce about 500 tons of paper a day, making a total production of 600 or 700 tons a day. At present the plant employs about 500 men and there are about 800 others on construction work. The new mill will be the last word in efficiency and up-to-date machinery and equipment.

The prospects ahead for Kapuskasing are the very best. Kapuskasing people confidently look forward to the town having a population of 5000 to 10,000 in the next five or six years. Some idea of the extent of the operations may be given by the fact that when the work at the mill and the townsite is completed, the company will have put in an investment of over \$25,000,000.

Mr. J. H. Black, well-known and highly regarded in Timmings and district is the general manager of the Spruce Falls Co. Mr. E. S. Noble, formerly manager of the Northern Canada Power Co., here, is the assistant manager. Mr. B. E. Martin, for many years a popular resident of Timmings is the office manager. Mr. J. Cain, formerly of Timmings, is on the office staff. Mr. Chas. Pearce, last year on the police force here, is now in charge of the time office at the plant. Many others from Timmings and Schumacher are now at Kapuskasing, including Messrs Donald MacDonald, engineer for Morrow and Beatty, Mr. Lark and Mr. Philoban, all of Schumacher. Accordingly, there will be special interest here in the great growth of Kapuskasing, in addition to the general satisfaction felt by the North in the development and progress of one of the new North Land towns.

**ROAD LOG OF ROUTE FROM TIMMINS TO FALLS**

Prepared by the Iroquois Falls Motor Club for the Benefit of the Motorists of the District.

As noted recently in The Advance the Iroquois Falls Motor Club has logged the roads of the district and these logs are now available to the general public. They should prove a great service. All the turns, railroad crossings, with the exact mileage and other particulars are given. The roads logged include:—Iroquois Falls to Timmings; Timmings to Iroquois Falls; Swastika to Cochrane; Cochrane to Swastika; Swastika to Timmings; Timmings to Swastika. The logs, "Iroquois Falls to Timmings," and "Timmings to Iroquois Falls" are published in The Broke Hustler this week. The others will be published from time to time. These road logs are well worth preserving. The following is the log for Timmings to Iroquois Falls, given as 44.9 miles:—

- 00.0—Leave Empire Hotel, going east through subway, past Hollinger mine to
- 1.2—Timmings City limits, jog left and right to
- 1.3—Schumacher.
- 1.9—Jog left across railroad.
- 5.5—So. Porcupine, straight through to last street.
- 5.8—Turn left.
- 7.0—Turn right.
- 8.6—Cross bridge, following edge of Porcupine Lake.
- 8.8—Turn left through Golden City.
- 8.9—Turn left.
- 9.0—Turn right.
- 9.5—Turn left at Station.
- 9.8—Jog right across railroad.
- 15.6—Cross railroad, straight through.
- 17.0—Hoyle, straight through across bridge.
- 19.9—Jog right across railroad at Drinkwater Pit.
- 22.1—Turn left.
- 23.7—Cross railroad.
- 24.2—Turn right.
- 25.1—Turn left.
- 25.8—Turn right.
- 26.1—Connaught, straight through across dam across Frederick-house river.
- 27.3—Cross railroad siding.
- 27.4—Bear right through Barber's Bay, across bridge.
- 27.8—Turn left, down grade to Lake bottom.
- 30.7—Bear right, up grade from Lake bottom.
- 31.0—Cross railroad.
- 34.7—Jog left across railroad, turn right and follow railroad.
- 37.8—Turn right.
- 38.0—Cross railroad.
- 38.3—Turn left.
- 41.9—Onagon, straight through.
- 44.0—Ansonville, turn left, cross railroad, turn right and follow railroad to
- 44.6—Iroquois Falls, jog left and right along Cambridge avenue to
- 44.9—Royal Bank, Iroquois Falls.
