TERMS OF AGREEMENT OF UNITED MINERALS LANDS

Notwithstanding the terms of the consolidation have been clearly set forth, it appears that some Mineral Lands stockholders are under the impression that they will be compelled to surrender a portion of their stock in order to enable their company to pay the 50 per cent. stock bonus to Paymaster stockholders.
