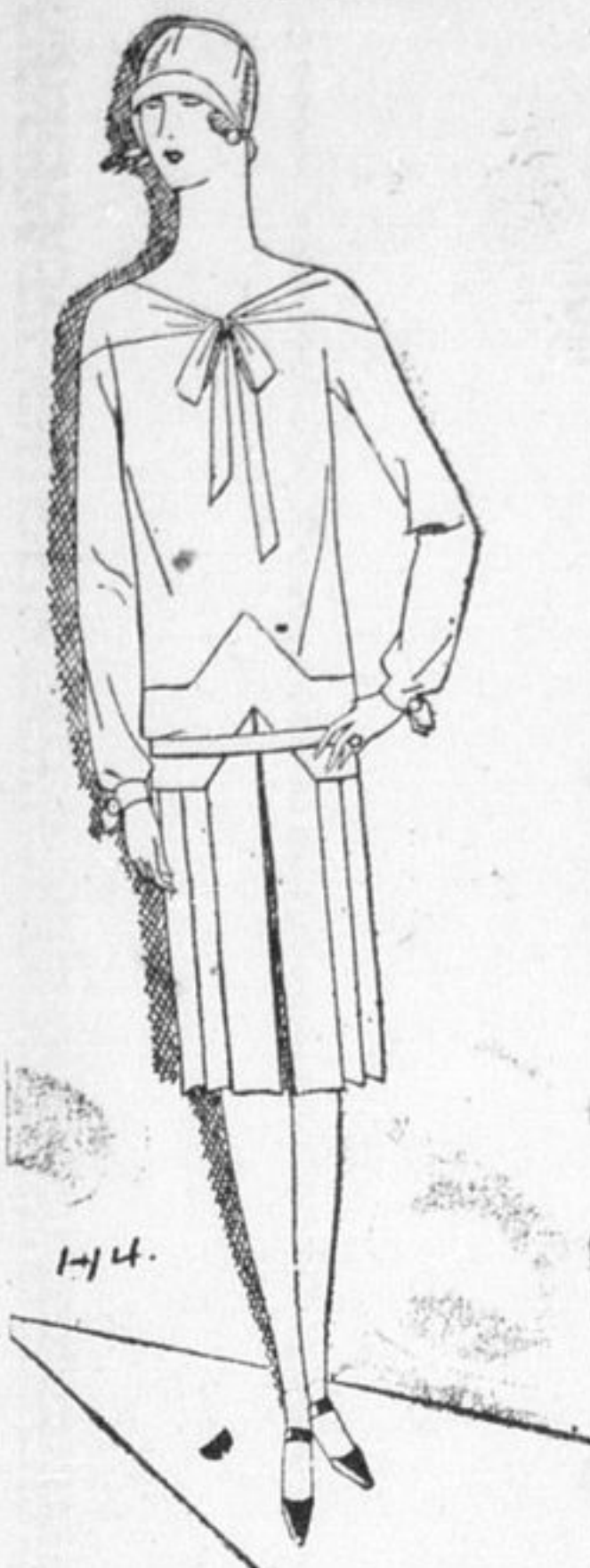


Fashion Fancies

Beige Satin-Backed Crepe is the Medium for This Charming Afternoon Frock.



The use of both sides of the material is the distinctive feature of this youthful dress of beige satin-backed crepe.

In the body of the dress, the crepe side of the material is used, while the drop yoke that ends in a tie, is of the satin side. The pointed inset around the hips is also of satin, while the narrow belt that crosses it and the cuffs are of crepe.

Two box plaits in the centre of the skirts give a new version of that old favourite, the kick plait, while plain wide plaits extend around the skirt.

The dainty gown above is made of flesh-coloured glove silk, trimmed in cream net. Neither of these materials lose their freshness when laundered.

The pointed yoke of glove silk is set over an under yoke of cream net. Deep points finish off the hem of the nightgown, thus carrying out the pointed effect at the top.

A full ruffle of two-inch cream-coloured net edges the points at the bottom, and perky bows of flesh-coloured satin ribbon finish off the neckline.

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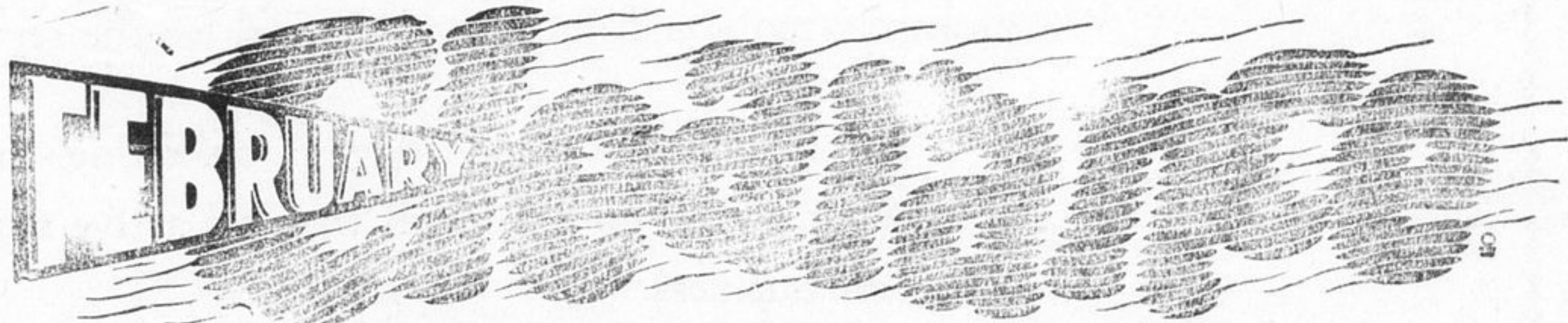
