EXCELLENT CONCERT IN AID ST. JOHN AMBULANCE

Programme of Special Merit Presented
by Cornish Social Club for
Benefit of Local First Aid
Work

The Cornish Social Club presented a noteworthy programme in the Goldfields theatre after the church services on Sunday evening, the event being for the benefit of the Timmins branch of the St. John Ambulance Brigade.

Mr. F. Y. Uttley, past president of the Lancashire Club, capably occupied the chair. In introducing the programme Mr. Uttley explained that the concert had been arranged by the Cornish Social Club for the benefit of the St. John Ambulance Brigade. The Ambulance Brigade was a self-supporting body, receiving no Government or municipal grants, but financing its work by money raised from dances, concerts and other events. Mr. Uttley briefly referred to the good work of the Ambulance Brigade in town where they were ready at all public events with skilled first aid work for any need that might arise. On the platform with Mr. Uttley was Mr. T. H. Richards, superintendent of the Timmins St. John Ambulance Brigade. A number of the members of the local Brigade were present in uniform and acted as ushers for the evening.

The opening number on the programme, a quartette by the Four Jacks, including those talented Cornish singers, Messrs Street, Snow, Rice and Major, set a high standard, but one that was maintained by the subsequent numbers on the excellent programme. The Four Jacks possessed fine voices, well balanced and blended, gave a harmonious and very attractive presentation of a special setting of "Annie Laurie." They won much merited applause for this pleasing number. Later in the evening, the Four Jacks favoured with a talented rendition of "Ye Banks and Braes," and were again very enthusiastically applauded.

One of the special features of the programme was the gifted piano playing of Mr. Vivian Carson, his selections winning very marked approval. Mr. Carson proved himself a master at the piano and his numbers were very heartily enjoyed.

Mrs. Laurey's sweet soprano voice was heard to advantage in "The Waters of Minnetonka," and an encore was insisted upon, the responding number being received with equal favour.

The instrumental duets by Messrs Wilkins and Starling were very popular, these artists being encored on each appearance. Mandolin, guitar, violin and a special trumpet-violin were used by these artists with noteworthy effectiveness, the pleasing music furnished being much enjoyed by the audience.

The programme also featured particularly pleasing solos by Mr. E. R. Street, Mr. A. Snow, Mr. A. Jenkins, and Mrs. G. Jenkin. Mr. Street's fine tenor voice was heard to advantage in pleasing selections that won very pronounced applause. Mr. Snow's presentation of a fine old sea song was another appreciated number. Mr. A. Jenkins gave a spirited and talented presentation of an attractive solo and won general applause. The duet, "Life's Dream is O'er," by Messrs Street and Snow was one of the outstanding numbers on the programme.

As usual in her appearances before a Timmins audience, Mrs. Geo. Jenkin delighted all with the richness and range of her fine voice and the talented presentation of solos of especial merit. Mrs. Jenkin was enthusiastically received and her solos were

much appreciated. Mr. Geo. Jenkin played the accompaniments on the piano for the solos by Mrs. Jenkin.

A very pleasing variation on the programme was the recitation, "Hullo," very effectively given by Miss James who showed notable artistic talent as an elocutionist. Miss James received a rousing recall and met equal appreciation for the brief number given in response.

Another extra special on the programme was the whistling solo by Master Lucas. This talented whistling artist, who brought his own accompaniment in the form of a gramophone and records, made a decided hit with his clever whistling solos.

The whole programme was generally considered as most successful and pleasing, and a material share of the credit for this is due to the talented work of Mrs. Wilkins as accompanist on the piano.
