PILGRIMAGE EXCURSION TO QUEBEC, JUNE 25, 1928

Announcement is made of the second annual "Souvenir" Colonization Excursion to Ottawa, Montreal, Three Rivers, Quebec and Ste Anne de Beaupre, under the distinguished patronage of Monseigneur J. A. Lecuyer, Vicar-General of the Diocese of Ste Marie.

Specially low fares and an attractive programme offer a rare opportunity for a holiday and to visit these famous points.

Excursionists will travel by regular trains to North Bay, from which a Canadian Pacific special train carrying coaches and standard sleepers will leave at 10.30 p.m. Monday, June 25th. On arrival at Ottawa at 6.30 Tuesday morning, the regular programme consists of a visit to the Experimental Farm where lunch will be served, or the day may be spent by visiting the Government Buildings, University of Ottawa, or other points of interest. A notable feature of the programme is a reception by Archbishop J. G. Forbes, after which there will be a concert.

The special train will leave Ottawa at 11.55 p.m., arriving Montreal 6.00 Wednesday morning. The programme includes a trip to St. Joseph's Oratory (Brother Andre), Confession, communion and high-mass at 9.00 a.m. Lunch is also obtainable, or the morning may be spent as one desires.

The special train will leave about 12 noon for Three Rivers and Cap-de-la-Madelaine, arriving at 4.00 p.m. (Blessed Virgin Sanctuary) special sermon, procession and benedictions of the blessed Sacrament. Returning to Three Rivers a reception will be given by the city council.

The special train will leave about midnight, arriving Quebec early Thursday morning. Special street cars will be ready to convey the party to the Shrine of Ste Anne de Beaupre. About 2.00 p.m. the party will arrive back in Quebec where there will be a reception by His Eminence Cardinal Rouleau, the City Council, St. John Baptist Society and the Knights of Columbus, after which dinner will be served, followed by a concert and other entertainment. -16.

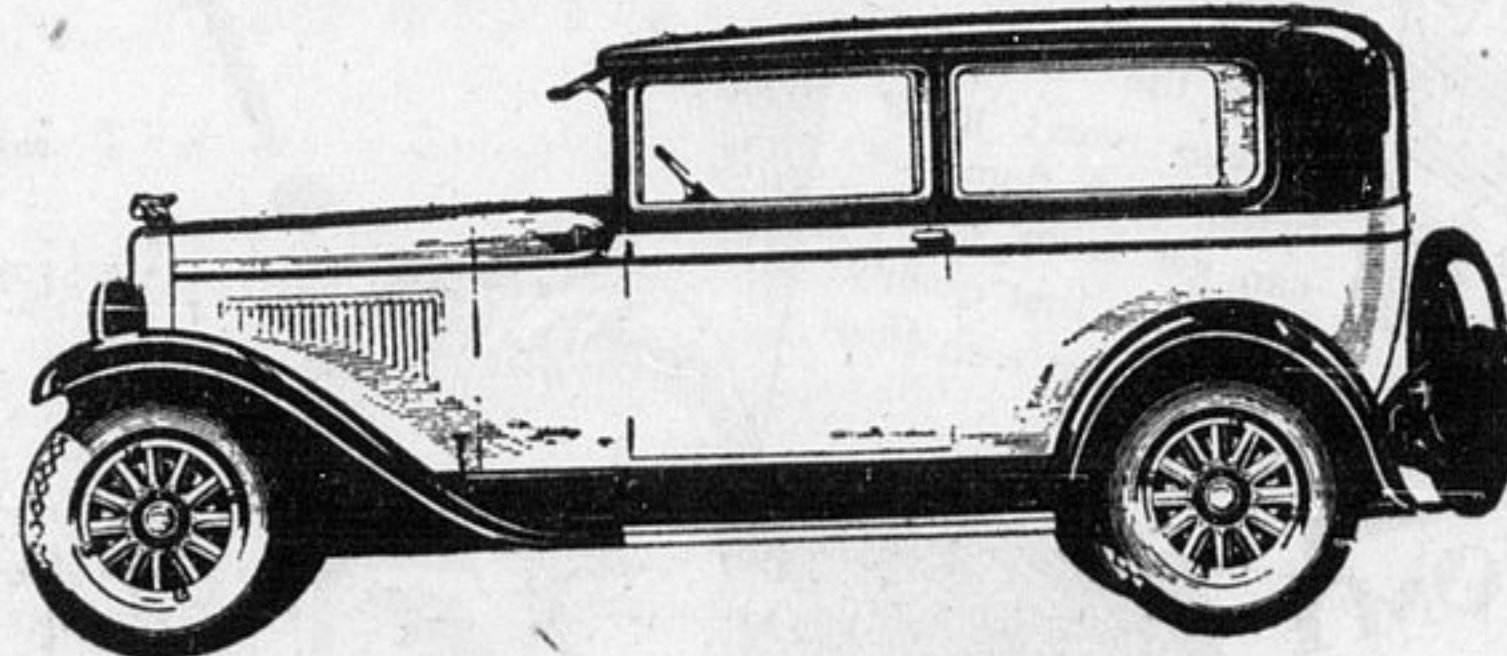
