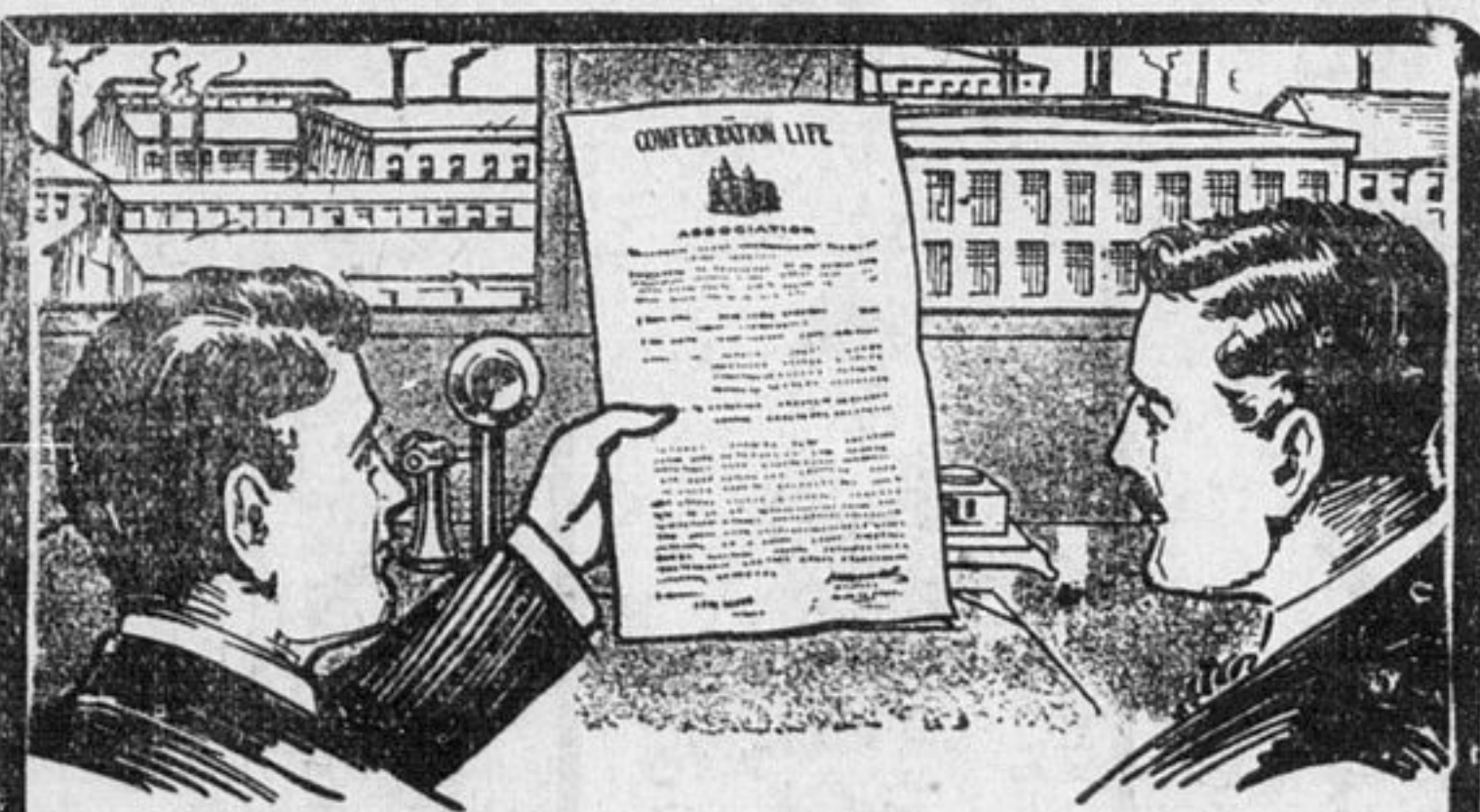

He is able to compare these figures with those of Marysville as his duties as city clerk covered the keeping of the vital statistics. Marysville and Yuba City combined, with 1000 more population than Timmins, had about a quarter the number of births, for the year, it is estimated."

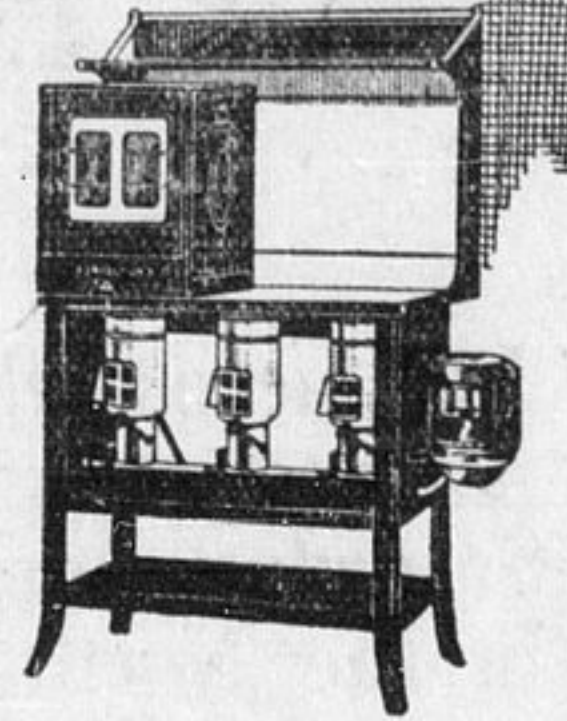
