He told us, in an interview, which he kindly granted, that South Porcupine reminded him very much of a town in the west where he had been stationed in his younger days when on the Royal Mounted Police Force. He stated that he thought the law and order evidenced here, where so many different nationalities were congregated, was remarkably good. He mentioned the provisions that are being made for patrolling the Ferguson highway.
