ESKIMO FILM STAR SAID TO BE DYING IN THE NORTH

Word from the far north says that "Maggie," the heroine of the motion picture play, "Nanook of the North," is very ill at an Eskimo camp near the trading post, Fort Harrison, Hudson's Bay. On account of her beauty and talent "Maggie" was selected as the star for the film referred to. This film was very successful and a fortune was made from it. Apparently, however, the star did not profit much from it, as she is now reported as in serious poverty. She is suffering from an injured pine. A few hundred dollars would mean her removal to hospital in the South and a chance for her recovery. This money, however, is not available and the chances are that the star of the picture, "Nanook of the North," will shortly pass away from earth's troubles and illness.

SUDBURY BOY OF NINE SAVES BABY FROM TRAIN

The story of the bravery and presence of mind of a boy of nine years of age in saving a little girl from death by being run over by a train is told as follows by a recent issue of The Sudbury Star:—
 "Great presence of mind and pluck on the part of Stanley Conron, Sudbury boy, aged nine, saved Kathaleen McArthur, two years and six months of age from certain death in the path of C.P.R. Train No. 17 on Thursday morning. The little tot was playing by the railway tracks near Geneva St. and as the train approached, was evidently too frightened to move. From the verandah of their homes Mrs. Thomas Vickers and Mrs. William Scott, Geneva St., saw the babe and screamed in terror. Their cries attracted the Conron lad's attention and, racing across the track he grabbed the helpless child and jumped to safety just as the train rushed by. Stanley's heroism was highly praised by those who witnessed the near tragedy, but he was a modest youth and on returning home casually mentioned the incident to his father, George Conron, who is a sergeant on the Sudbury police force. Father and mother at first mildly took their boy to task for playing near the railway tracks, but not when neighbours told them the entire story. The rescued child's parents are newcomers to Sudbury and reside on Geneva St."

Timmins Wins Championship of Temiskaming Junior Ball

Will Now Play North Bay Juniors for Championship of Northern Ontario. Big Crowd at Junior Ball Game Yesterday and a Good Game of Much Interest.

Yesterday the final game was played in the Temiskaming Junior Baseball Association, the Timmins Juniors winning from Cochrane Juniors after a lively and interesting game. The score was 18 to 11. There was a specially large crowd out for the feature and all liked the game.

Timmins Juniors are now the champions of the Temiskaming Junior Baseball Association, and will now play North Bay for the Junior Ball championship of Northern Ontario. Home and home games may be arranged or the series played at North Bay.

BOB BRUCE MAKES FIND OF INTEREST IN QUEBEC

The North Bay Nugget this week says:—

"An interesting discovery has just been reported by "Bob" Bruce, an old time prospector and one of the earliest stakers in Porcupine, who has just returned from a prospecting expedition in Quebec. The discovery consists of a large pyrrhotite dyke, said to be 15 feet wide and specimens from which show considerable mineralization with some chalcopyrite. The showing is located in Dufay township and is said to be the scene of considerable recent staking. Mr. Bruce has a group of four claims located around the discovery. After the experience of Noranda the occurrence of bodies of pyrrhotite with copper associated is regarded as extremely significant by engineers who are familiar with conditions in the Rouyn country. Barren pyrrhotite may not be significant in itself but where there are values in copper along with it there is a strong probability according to some authorities that greater concentration of copper values may be found at greater depth as a result of replacement of the pyrrhotite by the chalcopyrite."
