
Results of the Lower School Examinations at Timmins

INDIAN CLAIMS TO HAVE LOST NUGGETS IN JAIL

The loss of three gold nuggets at Burwash Industrial Farm (which owner, Moses Tacoma, Manitowaning Indian, claims were worth \$250, is being investigated by the Attorney-General's Department. INCORPORATION OF TWO NEW AVIATION COMPANIES

Among the recent incorporations under Dominion charter are two aviation companies. The two new aviation companies illustrate the increased interest being taken in transportation by air. The two new companies incorporated are the National Air Transport Co. and the Great Western Airway Co. The National Air Transport has been organized for the purpose of transportation business, including the carrying of mail, passengers, package freight, advertising work and aerial photography and having power to engage in the building of aeroplanes. The Great Western Airway has been incorporated to develop the business of aviation in all its branches in Western Canada, in the first place to acquire additional aeroplanes and equipment and to erect hangars.

CURIOUS EPITAPH IN CORNWALL CEMETERY

("Peter Simple" in the Morning Post)

Here is a curious epitaph which I saw not long ago on a tombstone in the churchyard at St. Buryan's church, Cornwall, whose fine fourteenth century tower—the second tallest in the country—can be seen from afar. The inscription is, I believe quite original, and I must own it caught my fancy—
Our life is but a winter's day:
Some only breakfast, and away:
Others to dinner stay, and are full fed;
The oldest only sups and goes to bed.
Large is his debt who lingers out the day;
Who goes the soonest has the least to pay."
The church has some remains of the building dedicated in 1238, and an early nineteenth century font made of Ludgvan granite, while the head of a cross outside the gate is supposed to date from a period between the seventh and ninth centuries.
