SWASTIKA THE LATEST SCENE OF NEW GOLD FIND

Free Gold Discovery About Two Miles From Swastika Causes a Rush Last Week.

Word from Swastika last week gave the information that a rush into that area was in progress, due to the glowing accounts of rich finds near the town of Swastika. According to the information from Swastika the miniature rush was especially due to an important discovery of free gold about two miles from Swastika Station. The discovery of this particularly rich ore was made by James Hughes, an old-time prospector of the North Land who has to his credit in the past the staking of such claims as the Teek-Hughes, the Chaput-Hughes, and others. The present find is understood to have been made quite close to the Ferguson Highway. It is said that the vein has been stripped right on to the highway and then picked up again on the other side of the road and work being done on that other side in the way of stripping and trenching. The find has created considerable excitement and there is special discussion of it around Swastika, where the general opinion seems to be that it bids fair to be the most important find in the district for some time past. One old prospector says it would create the greatest rush of the past few years if it were only about a hundred miles from a railroad or highway, but being so convenient, it is looked upon as too easy and comfortable for the ordinary prospector. Of course, there is not much unstacked territory in the district and that, of course, is one big factor in preventing any big rushes.

SIXTY-THREE MEN AT WORK AT HOWEY IN RED LAKE.

The amount of work in progress at the Howey Gold Mines in Red Lake is indicated by the fact that sixty-three men are at work there at the present time. Mr. John Jones, who has just returned from the Red Lake area, says that the Howey is making good and promises to be a big mine. The results from the work on the claims continue to be favourable and most promising.

BIG SNAKE KILLED AT HAEWYER FARM LAST WEEK.

There are more snakes in the North Land than there are in Ireland, though usually there are not any particularly large one hereabouts. This year the number of snakes seem to be larger than ordinary. Generally, the snakes in this district are of the common garden variety, harmless and usually small. The usual snake found in this district very seldom measures more than two feet in length. Last week, however, one specimen was found in the house at Haewyer Farm, Mountjoy, this snake measuring over 4 feet in length. While this big snake was a common garden snake and so free from poison, on account of its size it could give quite a nasty bite.

HOCKEY PLAYER REPORTED TO HAVE SHOT THE CALF

Often in the summer time, hockey players are accused of "shooting the bull," but word from Cobalt is to the effect that Elmer Maracle, the well-known hockey player, is wanted by the provincial police at Cobalt on the charge of "shooting the calf," the said calf being a year-old. The calf is further said to have died from being shot. According to the provincial police version of the matter, Maracle had been visiting his mother at Paradise Bay, and the calf and the calf's old woman, strayed onto the Maracle farm from a neighbouring place. Maracle is said to have shot at both, but only killed the calf. The lady who owned the calf and the calf's mother went to Cobalt to lay a complaint for the unauthorized making of veal, but in the meantime Maracle had gone away again. It is understood that he motored to Sudbury on part of his holiday trip.

BIG GANG WORKING ON THE DAM FOR RED LAKE POWER

Morrow and Beatty Have the Contract for the Dam at Ear Lake for Red Lake Power.

There are close to 140 men at work in the building of the conservation dam at Ear Lake in the Red Lake district. Morrow and Beatty, the well-known contractors have the work of building this dam and are going at the work with their usual energy. By means of this dam the water of Lac Seul will be raised about fourteen feet. At the present time a large force of men are at work transporting cement and other material. The water route is being used for transportation and it is intended to have the material all on the scene of activities before the freeze-up. Also, present plans are along the line of completing the dam before the spring break-up. It is expected that the work will be completed in time to hold the high water of the coming spring. The dam at Ear Lake is the first

step in the big plans under way to provide the development of hydro-electric power for the big new mining camp of Red Lake. Many properties in that camp are now progressing to the stage where the use of power is a necessity and by spring it is expected that there will be a list of mines awaiting power to enable them to carry out the ambitious programmes planned. With the advent of power the Red Lake mining camp should take an added march forward.
