McIntyre Tied Once More With the Wright Hargreaves

Game at Kirkland Lake Tuesday Makes the Third Tie Between the Champions of the North and the South for the Championship of the North Land and the R. A. McInnis Cup. Another Great Ball Game From the Spectators Standpoint.

In the game at Kirkland Lake on Tuesday in the series for the finals of the Temiskaming Baseball League, for the third time in the play-offs the McIntyres, of Schumacher, and the Wright-Hargreaves, of Kirkland Lake, played to a tie, the final score being 10 to 10 when the game was called on account of darkness.

A report, play by play, was received at the A. E. Moysey office here and Mr. W. O. Langdon announced the play as it came over the wire. There was a large crowd of baseball fans at the Moysey office to hear the returns and all appreciated this generous service.

The following is a report of the game as condensed from the play-by-play report coming here over the A. E. Moysey & Co. private wire.

There is a nice crowd. If the rain keeps away, it will be fine. Umpires:—Dr. Telsch, behind the bat; McIntyre on bases.

First innings—McIntyre—Chisholm singled clearly over second. Rothwell singled out to Anderson in left field. Nice catch by Anderson. Fitzjohn bunted; Lemon muffed it. Cowden singled over second. Bases full. Monaghan singled out to left field. Chisholm scored after catch. Murray singled along third, scoring two. Hackett out on a weak grounder in front of plate McCool to Smith. Three runs.

Wright-Hargreaves—R. Lemon singled just inside of first. Hackett missed it by an inch. Smith singled to left field. Scott struck out on a high one. S. Lemon fled to centre and Chisholm, after catching an easy one, dropped the ball. Russ Lemon scored, the catcher having him beat, but the umpire claimed he never touched him.

Scott hit to second baseman who over-threw in attempting to catch Smith at home, and Smith scored. Anderson out, Rothwell to Hackett. McCool doubled to left field, scoring Lemon and Scott. Tiche singled to left and Murray let the ball roll past him, McCool scoring. Chatrand fled out to J. Monaghan. Score 5 to 3.

Fourth innings—McIntyre—Murray out, Lemon to Smith. Hackett singled between third and short. Monaghan singled clearly over short. Valin popped out to third, infield fly. Chisholm up. Hackett nearly got caught at second. Chisholm out, Chatrand to Smith. No runs, 2 hits, no errors.

Boy Found \$600 Diamond Ring Outside Bay Hotel

A despatch last week from North Bay says:

"While looking for comic papers among the rubbish thrown out at the Empire Hotel to-day, young Ernest Sagadore, found the \$600 engagement ring lost here last Friday by Mrs. Leroy Phillips, of Clawson, Michigan. The loss of the valuable gem was first discovered after Mr. and Mrs. Phillips, who are on their wedding trip, had reached Halleybury, and a search was immediately started at the Empire Hotel where the young couple had been staying. Deputy Chief Dennis investigated the matter while the police in Halleybury were also doing the same as it was not known definitely if the ring was lost in this city. The ring contained one large diamond and 16 smaller ones, set in platinum. This morning when young Sagadore found two comic papers the ring fell out but the lad did not realize its value. He wore it for two hours before his brother noticed it, after which the manager of the Empire Hotel as well as the police were notified. Deputy Chief Dennis positively identified the jewel and to-night Mr. and Mrs. Phillips returned from Halleybury and secured it."

Mr. and Mrs. James Henderson, of Toronto, were among those motoring to Timmins last week.

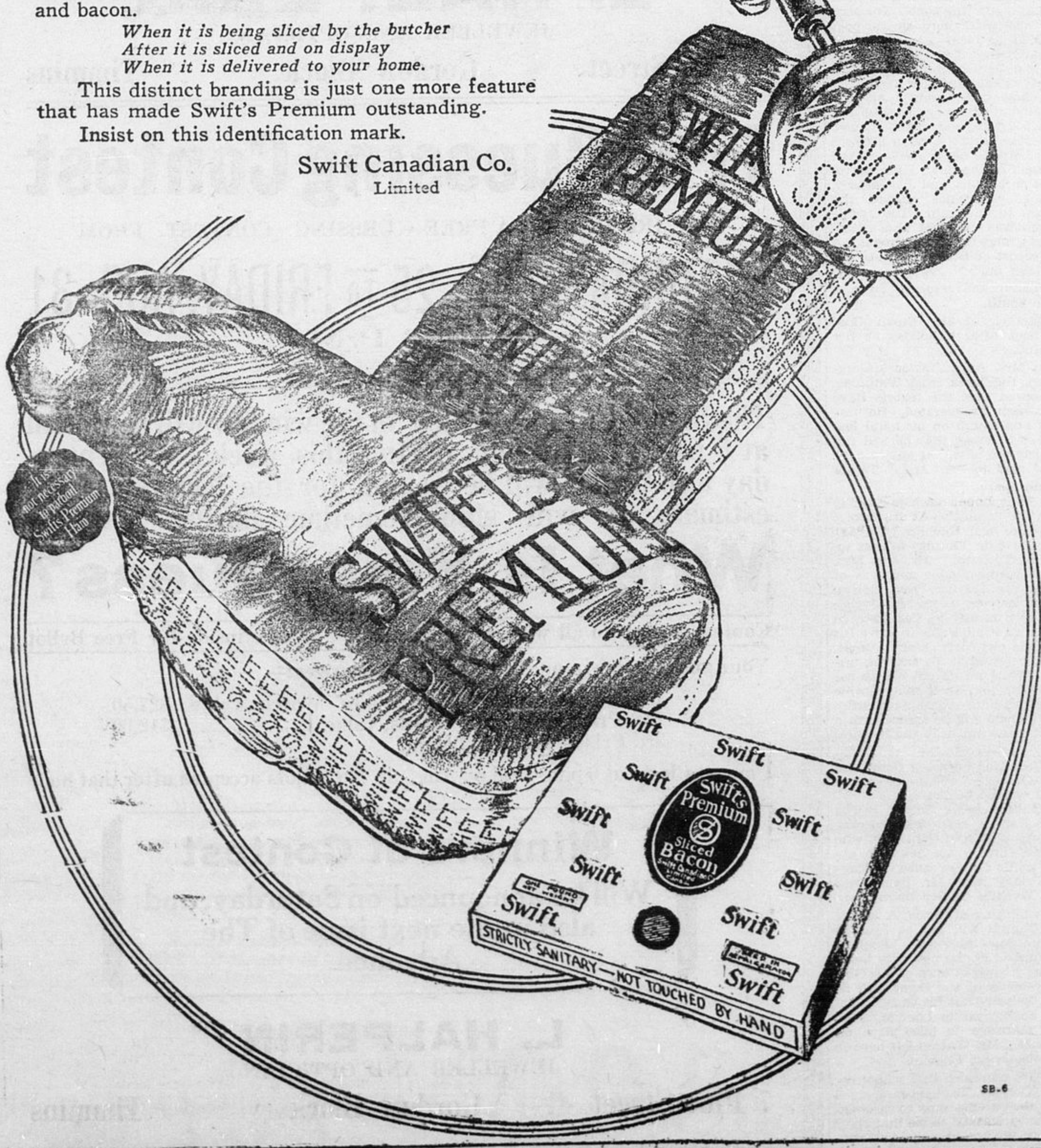
