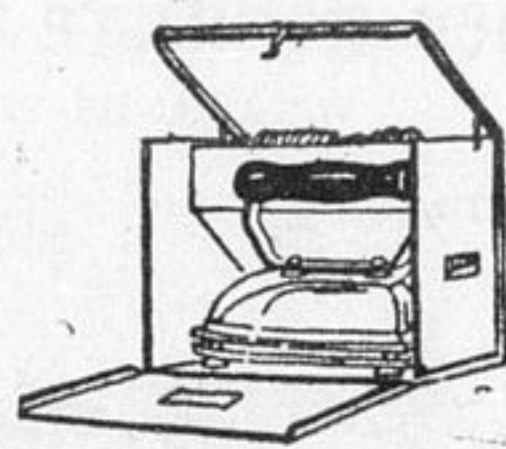
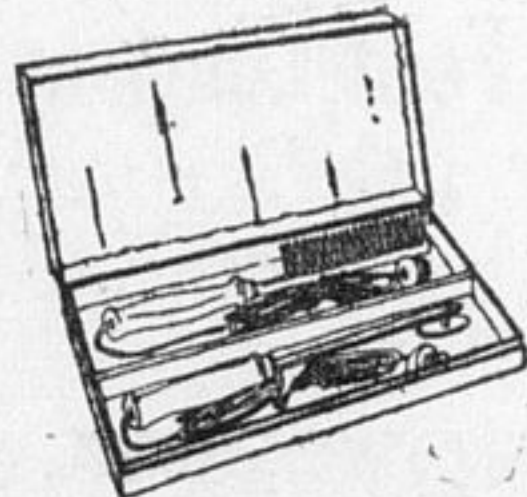

CANADIAN LEGION SHOWS RESENTMENT OF ARTICLE

Sudbury Returned Men Express Objection to References to Royalty in Finnish Newspaper

At a meeting of the Canadian Legion in Sudbury last week very emphatic protest was made in regard to an article in the Finnish newspaper, "Vapaus," published at Sudbury. The Legion felt that the article in question was disloyal and altogether objectionable, and the soldiers called upon the authorities to take proper action in the matter. It was through the loyal attitude of The Sudbury Star and the Canadian Legion that the authorities took up the matter. As a result of the enquiry and investigation carried on by the authorities Arvo Vaaro, the editor of "Vapaus" was arrested on a charge of publishing seditious slander with reference to His Majesty King George and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales. Vaaro was remanded a week on \$10,000 bail put up by the manager of "Vapaus."

At the legion meeting there was much indignation at the article complained of, and also protest against the "Red" schools conducted to teach children to disregard the Government and religion. The Legion asked further investigation of the Finnish paper "Vapaus," and those behind it, and also a full enquiry into the conduct and teaching of the school known as the Pioneer school or Young Pioneers, organized in Sudbury. One speaker said that he had heard that some of the Reds boasted that they had 4000 Finnish radicals at Sudbury now and as many more coming and that in time they would crowd all others out of the district.

The meeting passed a resolution of appreciation to The Sudbury Star and the Rev. T. D. Jones in bringing the statement to the attention of the public. Another resolution, passed by the meeting, called on the Sudbury town council to call a mass meeting of all the loyal subjects of the district to express their disapproval of the disloyal and treasonable sentiments.

The main resolution passed by the Legion in regard to "Vapaus" and its activities was as follows:—

"Whereas in a Finnish newspaper, published in Sudbury under the name of Vapaus, in the issue of December 4, 1928, there appeared a leading editorial with reference to the regrettable illness of His Majesty, King George V, and whereas in the said editorial most unjust comments were made and terms used in making light of our King's illness and bringing his name and the names of other members of the royal family into ridicule and contempt, and whereas the publication of such a vile editorial is likely to lead to a public disturbance amongst His Majesty's loyal subjects in the town and district of Sudbury; and whereas it is known as a fact that the Finnish paper Vapaus sponsors and advocates the teaching or disloyalty both to our King and forms of government and is absolutely Communistic in its views and urges the teaching of such doctrines in a school in Sudbury known as the pioneer school; and whereas the members of the Canadian Legion and the British Empire Service League, in open meeting assembled, are of the opinion that the publication of such an editorial and the sponsoring of the spread of disloyalty and anti-British teaching is most harmful to the public weal and likely to lead to a condition of civil war if not immediately stopped.

"Be it therefore unanimously resolved:—

First—That the said Finnish newspaper, Vapaus, be ordered to retract wholly and unequivocally the terms used and things said concerning the illness of His Majesty King George V, and remarks used concerning other members of the royal household immediately.

Second—That the matter be investigated fully by the proper officers of the Crown, and that the person or persons responsible for the writing and publishing of the said defamatory and slanderous editorial, be deported to their own country.

Third—That if any ordinary anti-British or anti-Christian doctrines are taught in the pioneer school the instructors, or those in charge, be deported.

Fourth—That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Crown Attorney of the district of Sudbury with the request that the same be taken up with the Attorney-General, and a copy be forwarded to the Dominion Command of the Legion, advising that it consult the proper officials of the Dominion Government that further necessary action may be taken."
