

Canadian Ambulance Had Good Year in 1928

A total of 166,883 certificates and awards have been issued by the Canadian Branch of the St. John Ambulance Association since its inception. It was disclosed in a report presented at the annual meeting of the association, held at Ottawa some days ago. The number of certificates totalled 25,555 in 1928.

The meeting was graced by the attendance of their Excellencies Viscount and Lady Willingdon, who referred to the rapid advancement of the association's activities in recent years. The Governor-General paid particular tribute to the British Columbia and Nova Scotia sections of the association and expressed a hope that the other Provinces would show proportional progress in 1929.

Hon. Hewitt Bostock, Speaker of the Canadian Senate, was unanimously elected President for another term.

Outstanding Programme for Meeting Canadian Mine Men

Annual Meeting Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy at Winnipeg on March 6th, 7th and 8th. Noteworthy Entertainment Features. Addresses by Dr. Corliss, John Hammell, Dr. R. C. Wallace, Hon. Chas. Stewart, and Other Leading Men in the Profession and in Public Life.

A distinguished gathering of mine men and representatives of allied interests will gather in Winnipeg during March 6th, 7th and 8th on the occasion of the thirtieth annual meeting of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy which will be held for the first time in its history in the Capital City of Manitoba. This is a tribute to the outstanding position Manitoba has assumed in the National Mining industry of Canada during recent years.

An international character will be added to the proceedings by the attendance of scientists from the United States, two of whom will present papers. The Hon. Charles Stewart, Federal Minister of Mines, will attend and reply to the toast of the Government of Canada at the annual banquet which will conclude the sessions. He will be accompanied by Dr. Charles Camsell who will preside at the Institute Luncheon on the opening day.

An old Manitoban, and a past President of the Institute, who has long been closely associated with mineral development in Manitoba and has consistently held to the opinion that Manitoba some day would make important contributions to the mining industry of Canada, will take the chair at the morning session of the second day. This is Dr. R. C. Wallace, formerly Commissioner of Mines for Manitoba and now President of the University of Alberta.

Other very well known Canadians who will attend are Mr. J. D. Galloway, Provincial Mineralogist of British Columbia, Dr. C. V. Corless, formerly manager of Mond Nickel Company who will present a paper entitled "The Frood Deposit; A suggestion as to its Origin"; and J. E. Hammill, President of Northern Aerial Minerals Exploration Ltd., a company pushing exploration into the farthest North. Mr. Hammill will contribute a paper describing the systematic methods adopted by his company in order that no important prospecting area may be overlooked.

Mr. F. W. Bradley, president of the American Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, and also president of the Treadwell Yukon Co. Ltd., has announced his intention to be present. This is the first time the President of the American Institute has attended a gathering of the Canadian Institute.

Mineral exhibits from various Provinces of Canada will be an important feature of the convention. The Dominion of Canada will be represented by a display which has been assembled under the direction of Dr. W. H. Collins, director of the Geological Survey, and Mr. E. Poitevin, chief of the mineralogical division of the department of mines.

Ontario will provide a very comprehensive display, befitting her prominence, and will send Mr. W. K. McNeill in charge. No mineral display representative of Canada could be considered complete without a contribution from Quebec and this will be forthcoming, as well as displays from Manitoba, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Nova Scotia. The Province of Quebec will be officially represented by Mr. A. O. Dufresne, director of the Provincial Bureau of Mines, and the Provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia by Messrs W. E. McMullen and J. P. Meserve respectively.

The entire arrangements are in the hands of the Manitoba Branch of the Institute with Chairman H. B. Lumsden as convener of committees, and Mr. D. V. Reddin as Honorary Secretary. Dr. J. S. DeLury, Commissioner of Mines for Manitoba, is in charge of the programme details, and entertainment has been entrusted to Col. L. D. M. Baxter, Managing Secretary of the Manitoba Chamber of Mines. Hon. J. Bracken, Premier of Manitoba, will extend the Province's official welcome to the visitors at the opening session, and Mr. D. McLean, Mayor of Winnipeg, will act as Winnipeg's host at a civic luncheon to be given on the second day of the meeting. The speaker guest of the Institute at the annual banquet on the closing day will be Mr. D. C. Coleman, Vice-President, Western lines, Canadian Pacific Railway.

THINKS THERE IS TOO MUCH EXCITEMENT IN TIMMINS

The sleepy town of Barrie, Ontario, abhors all excitement that disturbs slumber. Of course, Barrie does not mind a few wholesale cattle thefts or a murder or two, being used to these, but other excitements are strictly barred. These few kind remarks being a preface to the following paragraph from The Barrie Examiner last week, the paragraph being in an interesting column headed, "The Weekly Mirror, Reflecting High Lights in the News from Ontario Town Newspapers." This paragraph reads:—

"Timmins has long since become accustomed to 'rushes,' gold and otherwise, but one out of the ordinary occurred the other day when the news was passed around that mining towns were to be declared out of bounds for government liquor stores. Numbers of foreigners, especially, hastened to lay in a supply of their favourite brands of 'Oh, be Joyful.' It was something in the nature of a 'rush' on the government institution. The situation developed from a misleading flare line across the top of a Toronto daily newspaper. The story which followed recorded an amendment to the Mining Act, stipulating that liquor could not be sold within six miles of any mine, except in 'cities, towns and villages.' It turned out that there was no cause for alarm, the exemption of 'cities, towns and villages' saving the situation. Singularly enough the Town Council the same day passed a resolution that henceforth only one warning would be given delinquents in arrears for water, before being shut off. This is altogether too much excitement in one day, even for Timmins."

TO TRY TO FLY AGAIN BY THE COCHRANE ROUTE OVERSEAS

A letter has been received in Cochrane from Bert Hassels an dhis partner, Parker Cramer, stating it is their intention to make another attempt this year to establish an aerial mail route from Chicago to Stockholm, Sweden, via Greenland. These are the Rockford fliers who made an unsuccessful attempt to reach Europe by a northern route last year, the attempt ending when they were forced to make a landing at Greenland. This year, according to the fliers, they will attempt the trip in 500 mile relays with refueling stations at Sault Ste. Marie, Cochrane and two located at intervals between Cochrane and Greenland. They have asked that the runway which they made use of last year in taking off from Cochrane, be kept open in preparation for a start this spring.

The fliers profess the greatest confidence that their second attempt will be successful.
