### EFFORT TO DEFEAT THE

In an effort to alleviate the situation induced by the heavy penalty of the stock tax which goes into effect on July 1, steps have already been taken by a number of western mining and oil companies to reduce the number of outstanding shares, according to Vancouver despatches. Shareholders will be asked to confirm proposals whereby they will receive one share in place of every four, and in some cases as high as ten, shares held at present.

The stock tax will bear heavily on low-priced stocks as it involves a charge of one-tenth of a cent. per share on sales of stocks under the market value of 50 cents. Therefore, companies especially those contemplating further financing, are considering plans for reorganization. Other companies, intervene to stop the impending tax provision, or with the idea of experiencing the actual effect of the tax before proceeding with reorganization.


