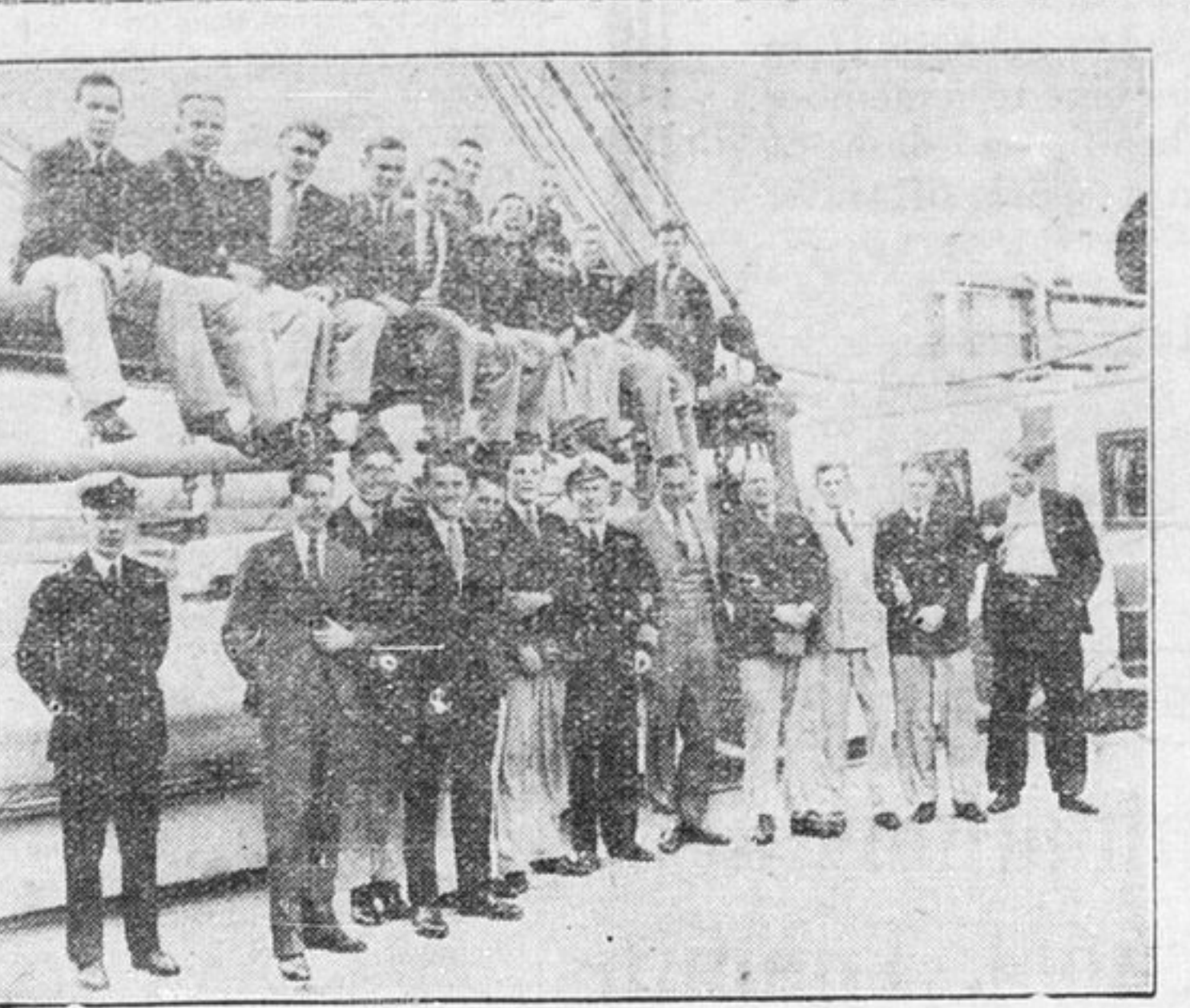


YOUNG MEN HAVE NARROW ESCAPE ON THE MATTAGAMI

Nine-Year-Old Lad Drowned In Pool Back of Gillies Lake

Little Eddie Godin Loses his Life on Tuesday Afternoon. Likely Stunned by Striking Head on Log. Brave Attempt Made by Young Companion to Rescue Him. Boys out Swimming Encounter Tragedy.

About 3.30 on Tuesday afternoon a tragic accident occurred at a small pool north of the compressor plant when Eddie Godin, the little son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Godin, of 68 Fourth avenue, lost his life in the water.

The news of the tragedy was brought into town by Danny Marshall, and the little lad's father, who is a shift boss at the McIntyre Mine, was notified of the tragedy. The remains were removed to S. T. Walker's undertaking parlours, where dozens of Eddie's school mates viewed the remains.
