Among those who should be in a position to know there seems to be a general opinion of hopefulness in regard to the building of the railway from Timmins to Kamiskotia.

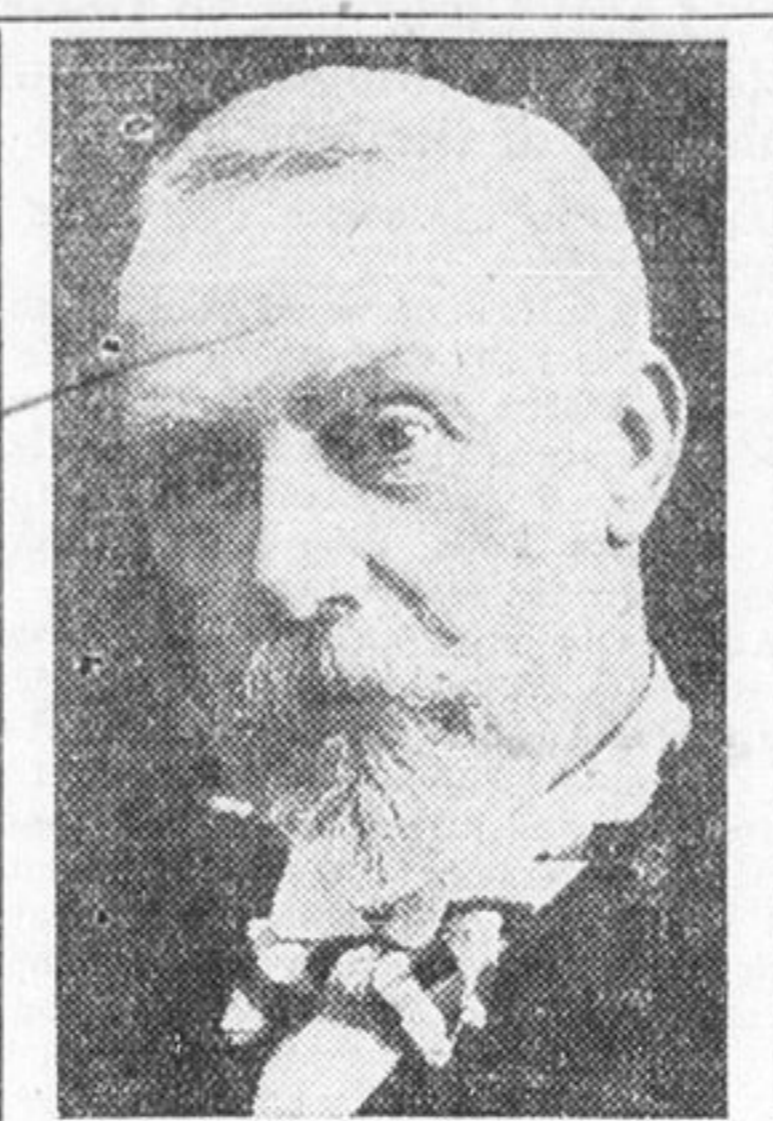
KIWANIS DELIGHTED WITH LOCAL MOTION PICTURES

STRANDED AT PORT BURWELL

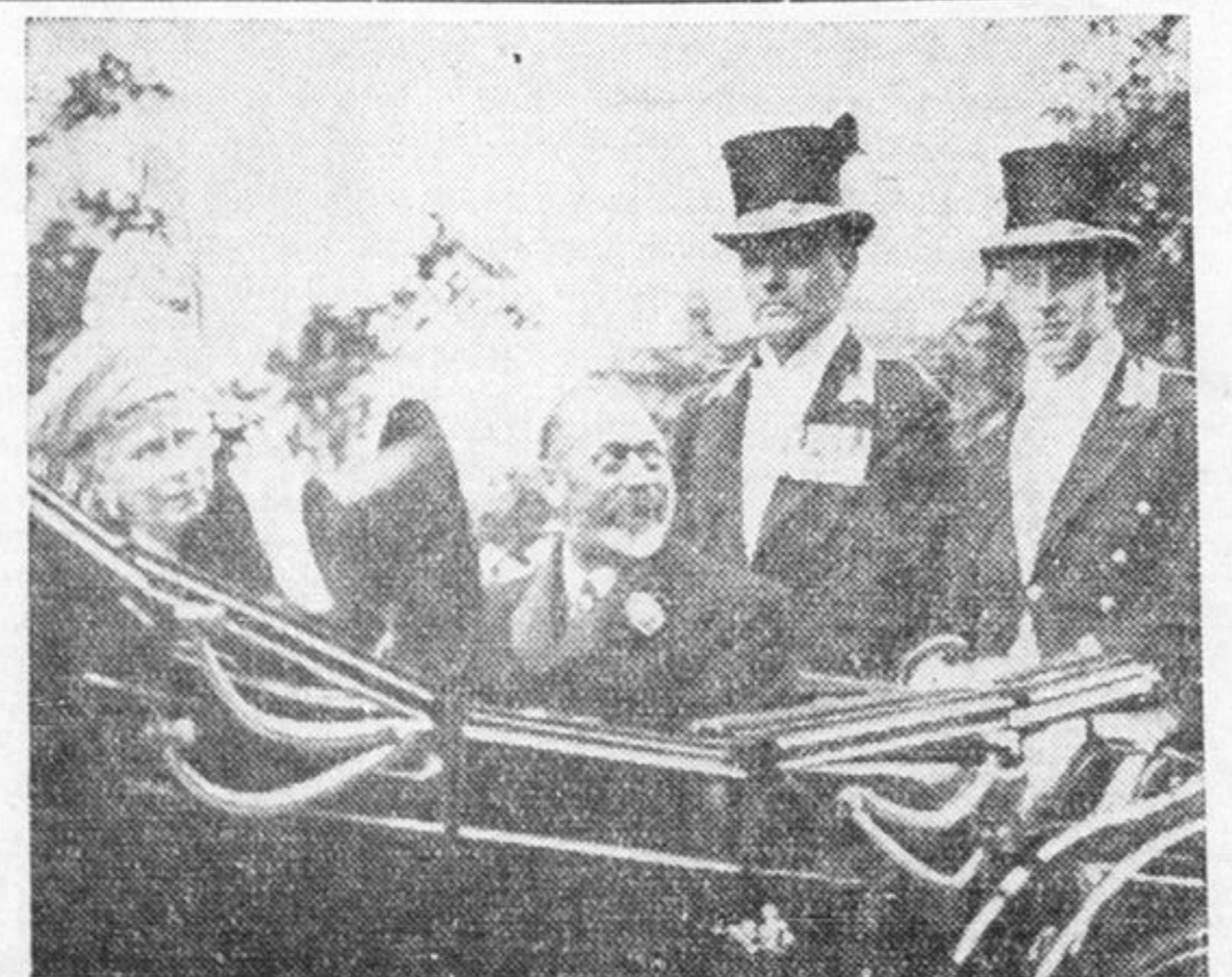

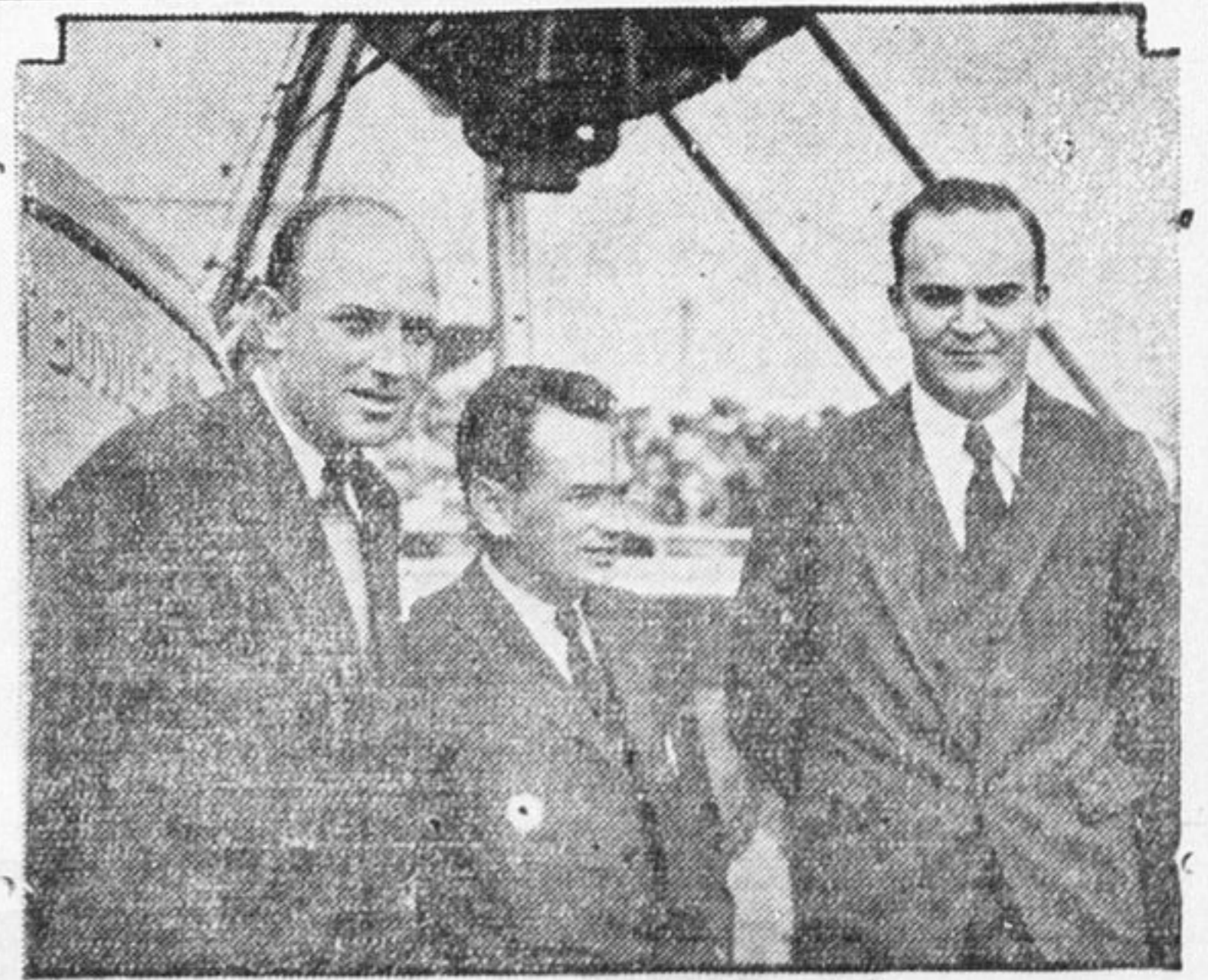
