ST. JOHN AMBULANCE DANCE WEDNESDAY EVENING, AUG 14

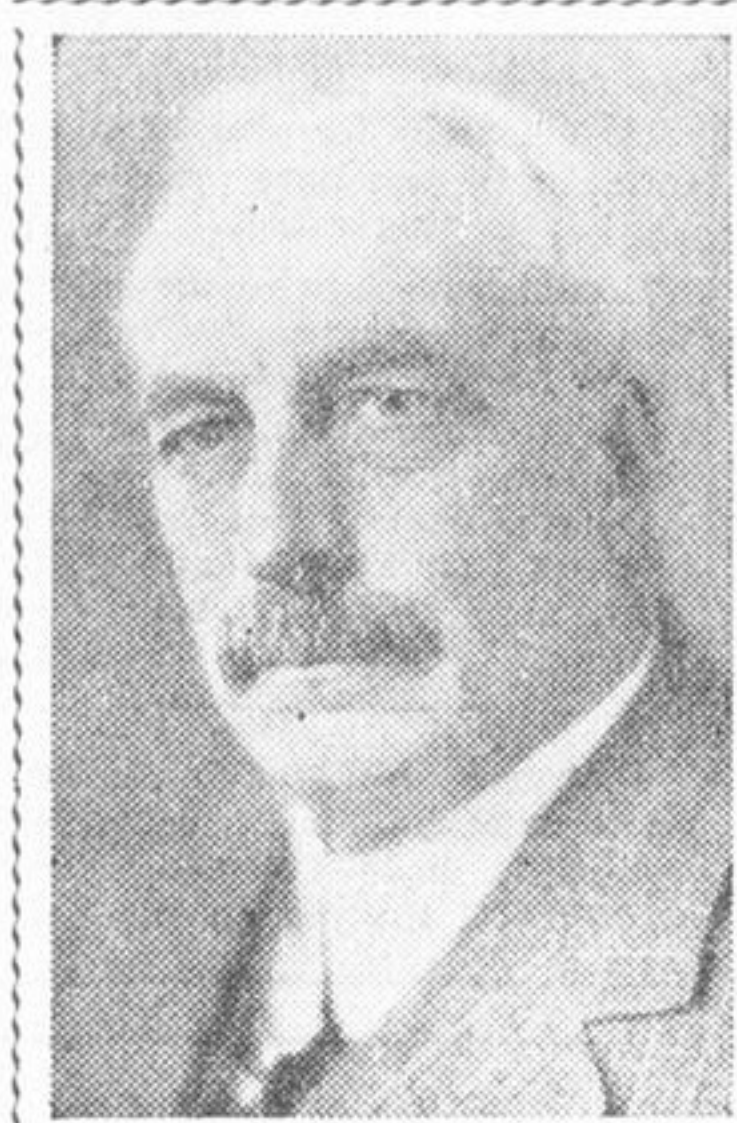
