Increase in McIntyre's Earnings for Half-Year

The official statement of the McIntyre Porcupine Mines, Limited, for the six months ending Sept. 30th, 1929, show increases all the way along over the same period in the previous fiscal year. The statement shows:—

Gross income, first quarter, \$1,062,611; second quarter, \$1,112,861; for the six months, \$2,175,472; increase over same period last year, \$65,966.

Net earnings, first quarter, \$470,112; second quarter, \$529,251; six months ending Sept. 30th, 1929, \$999,363; same period last year, \$980,997; increase, \$18,365.

Less, provision for taxes for period, first quarter, \$28,932; second quarter, \$30,888; six months, \$59,820; same period last year, \$50,465; increase, \$9,355.

Net earnings before depreciation, first quarter, \$441,179; second quarter, \$468,362; six months ending Sept. 30th, 1929, \$909,542; same period last year, \$930,532; increase, \$9,010.

Booklet on Prevention and Cure of Rickets

Dr. Helen McMurchy, of the Child Welfare Division of the Dept. of Health, Ottawa, has issued a very valuable booklet entitled "Rickets; Prevention and Cure." The booklet should prove of great value to parents and also very helpful in building up better health. Dr. McMurchy has the necessary knowledge to write as an expert on the subject, having specialized in the matter of the health of children, and in addition she has a talent with the pen that enables her to present her knowledge in interesting and effective way.

Rickets is the commonest disease of children in our large towns, says one of the authorities noted in the booklet. Children that have had slight or severe rickets do not grow well or thrive well. They are often backward at school. Their teeth are soft and decayed. They are more likely than other children to have colds, bronchitis, convulsions, pneumonia and other diseases. They often have adenoids and enlarged tonsils. Accordingly, there will be a general desire to eliminate rickets if that is practical. Indeed, it is not very difficult. "Sun, cod liver oil and suitable food prevents rickets," says Dr. McMurchy.
The booklet emphasizes that rickets is a disease of nutrition caused by lack of sun and lack of suitable food. It begins soon after birth and may not be noticed in infancy or childhood but still it may do harm more or less all through life.

The signs by which rickets may be known as present are detailed in the booklet, and it is pointed out that though rickets may be cured, it is still better to prevent the condition. This may be done by the use of sun, suitable food and cod liver oil.

Free copies of the booklet, "Rickets, Prevention and Cure" may be obtained free on request from the Deputy Minister, Dept. of Pensions and National Health, the Elgin Building, Ottawa. All parents should see that they have a copy of this booklet. It is easy to read and easy to understand, and by a reading of it and the observance of its slogan, "Sun, Cod Liver Oil and Suitable Food Prevent Rickets" this disease of children may be added to the several others that have been practically eliminated through the good work of applied medical science.
