

**FORMER GUARD NOW ONE OF INMATES AT BURWASH**

A despatch this week from Sudbury says that pleading guilty to theft,

George Dewey alias George Williams a former guard at Burwash Industrial Farm, appeared before Magistrate Stoddart in Copper Cliff police court on Thursday and was sentenced to a

month in the institution in which he was formerly guard. Dewey was given the opportunity to make restitution and go on suspended sentence, but was unable to do so. The offence which he committed occurred well over a year ago when Dewey departed from the prison farm taking with him a raincoat, a suitcase and a cheque for \$17, the property of one of his fellow guards. In Sudbury, he cashed the cheque without difficulty and made his way to New York. Nothing more was heard of him until about a week ago when he walked into a police station in Windsor and gave himself up. It is said that he was suffering from qualms of conscience and that he wanted to clear up his past before his marriage, which is to take place soon.

**MODERN HOSPITAL TO BE BUILT SOON AT NORTH BAY**

At North Bay on Tuesday announcement was made by His Lordship Bishop D. J. Scollard, of the diocese of Sault Ste. Marie, that a community of sisters were prepared to proceed within a year with the erection of a modern hospital in North Bay. The proposed hospital will provide accommodation for from 50 to 60 patients and will involve an approximate expenditure of \$240,000. The new hospital will be of the latest design and when completed will be the most modern and best equipped in Northern Ontario. The new hospital will be entirely a private enterprise. No contributions are being asked from the citizens, either for its construction or its maintenance. It will be strictly self-sustaining.
