GOOD ROADS ASSOCIATION FAVOURS HIGHWAY PLAN

Delegates from Practically Every Part of the Dominion Express Favour for the Proposed Highway Across the Dominion of Canada.

Recently the establishment of a national coast to coast highway across Canada was strongly endorsed as a three-fold boon to the Dominion, by delegates from practically every province, conferring on highway and traffic problems at Toronto, under the auspices of the Canadian Good Roads Association.

Such a national highway, it was urged, would primarily tend to increase communication between the different sections of the Dominion, and thus make for the abolition of sectional differences, and for greater national amity and understanding.

Secondarily, it would prove of immense financial benefit to the Dominion, by bringing in more tourists, who would make longer journeys over Canadian highways, and in doing so, spend more money in the Dominion.

In the third place, the undertaking of such a project would go far toward relieving unemployment, without proving too severe a drain on the finances of the provinces of the Dominion, since it would more than pay for itself in increased tourist revenue, within a few years.

Federal aid for the project was favoured by a number of delegates, who took the stand that while highway construction and maintenance came naturally under provincial jurisdiction, a project of such national character was bound to benefit the Dominion as a whole. The necessary construction would be comparatively only the surfacing of a few stretches of roadway to link up the provincial systems already in existence.

Uniformity of traffic laws and signs among the nine provinces of the Dominion was another subject under discussion, the delegates agreeing that if speed limits, lighting and brake regulations and registration fees could be standardized, and uniform highway signs adopted, motor traffic between the provinces and between Canada and the United States would be greatly facilitated.

A similar movement toward uniformity is now under way in the United States.

The question of regulation and licensing airplane traffic also came before the conference, discussion centering on the question of whether such licensing should be in the hands of the Dominion or of the provinces. Other topics discussed included the campaign for the elimination of level railway crossings, now being conducted by the federal government and the Dominion board of railway commissioners, in co-operation with the provinces, and other safety regulations, including requiring all automobiles to come to a full stop at railway crossings and at all main highways or boulevards, uniform location of mail boxes, provincial responsibility for bridge maintenance, beautifying of highways, and the regulation of bus traffic, together with the question of whether bus competition or monopoly was more desirable.
