CANDIDATES NOMINATED IN 70 OUT OF 245 RIDINGS

Only One Acclamation So Far, Leader of U.F.A. Receiving That Honour. First Official List of Contestants for Dominion House. Nominations were held in 70 constituencies Monday of this week, two weeks before the general Federal election. Nominations in the remaining 175 ridings of Canada will take place next Monday, and the election will be on July 28. Candidates are required by law to be 21 years old, to be British subjects not disqualified by law. A deposit of \$200 is required, and is not returned if a candidate fails to secure at least half of the votes secured by the victorious candidate.
