Noted Mining Engineer's Pork and Beans Recipe

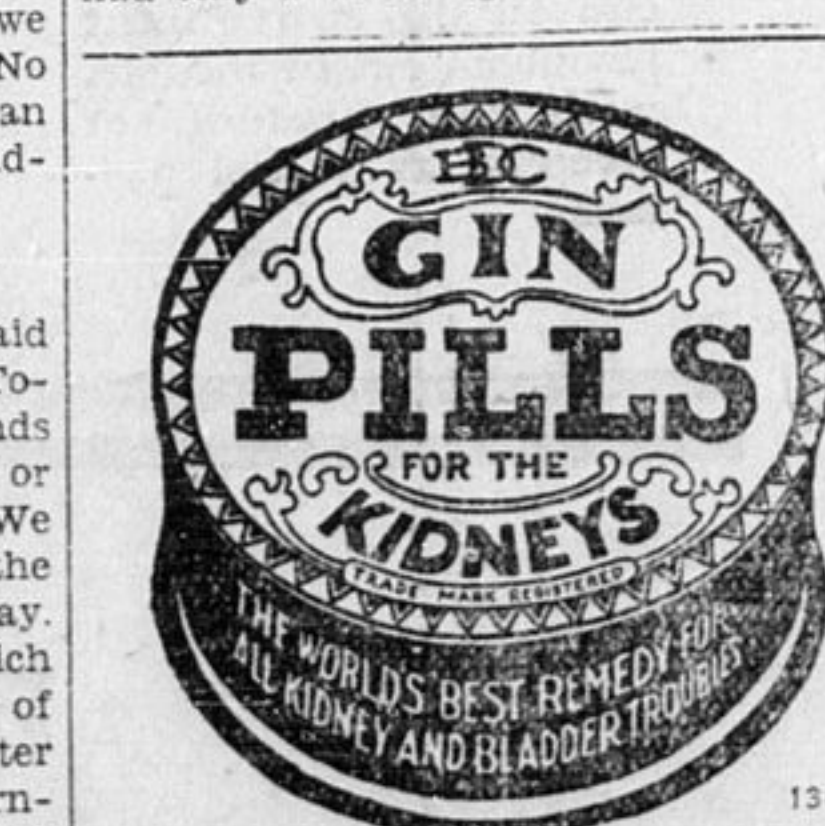
Ordinary men may long for stuff like mother used to make, but many of the old-timers of the North Land, though loving their wives and mothers, still have the idea that neither wife nor mother can cook pork and beans the way some beloved side-kick in the bush used to do it. Of course, this food business is all a matter of sentiment and association.

To get back to the pork and beans, however, as many will like to do, it may be noted that The Northern Miner, perhaps in the absence of other exciting stocks news, has been dishing up pork and beans to its readers. In the last issue of The Northern Miner there is the following article on this sentimental topic:

"Our editorial on 'Pork and Beans' seems to have started something. The gist of letters from readers appears to be: 'You have told us all about how wonderful pork and beans are. You have accused our wives and sweethearts of not knowing how to prepare them. But you do not offer any remedy for the condition which you deplore. Give us the recipe.'"

"So, consulting fellow lovers of the comestible, whose experience, by the way, has been quite similar to the personal one complained of, it was found that Frank C. Loring, M.E., was famed for his ability to juggle ingredients with delectable results. Moreover, in a praiseworthy spirit of co-operation he provided the directions. 'It will be noted in reading these over that here is no careless assemblage of materials, no hasty consigning of vegetable and meat to heat treatment. It takes just about 24 hours to get the desired results. It is perhaps too much to expect that any family cook will go to the necessary trouble. That is one of the difficulties of producing any work of art. The job cannot be done on a commercial production basis. The final result in this case will justify the time and the effort. Here is the recipe for Pork and Beans a la Frank C. Loring, M.E.:'"

"Saturday night before going to bed put the beans to soak. Sunday morning when you get up add a pinch of soda and parboil the beans for about half an hour, and drain them off. Then add, quantities to suit taste and experience, New Orleans molasses, cayenne pepper, mustard, tabasco sauce, salt and pepper and a little Worcestershire sauce; stir together. Take a regular Boston bean pot, a broad-based earthen pot with small neck, and place a small onion at the bottom; then put in the mixture and let it bake all day. As the moisture evaporates quite rapidly water will have to be added throughout the day. Two hours before serving add a pound of back bacon for a four-quart bean pot, spreading carefully over the top of the beans, and put back in the oven. 'If performed by a master hand this process will produce baked beans, whole and brown.'"

VIPOND REPORT FOR YEAR IS VERY SATISFACTORY ONE

Report Shows Increased Production and Reduced Costs. Reserves of Ore Added to, Production Earnings and Total Assets Larger Than in 1929 Report

The annual report of the Vipond Consolidated Mines, Limited, was issued last week, and the statement is a very pleasing one. Summarized, it may be said that ore reserves are considerably higher, production has increased, costs have been reduced, net earnings have increased from ten to seventeen per cent., and the future prospects are bright. The report is one that will please the public and that reflects the highest credit on those responsible for the progress being made by the Vipond. Special credit would seem to be due to the mine manager, R. Dye, for what the Vipond is accomplishing without any noise:

The following figures from the report will be of general interest:— The operating profit for the year under review, before allowing for depreciation and writing off other charges, amounted to \$385,974, as against \$300,544 for the preceding year. Ore reserves are estimated at 163,525 tons of \$8.23 grade, or \$1,346,000. This represents an increase in quantity of about 36,000 tons, and in gross value approximately \$300,000 over last year. Improvement in ore position is the result of development of known lenses; there is no report of important contributions from low level exploration.

Net current assets, not including the subscription of \$250,000 to Huronian Mining and Finance Company, amount to \$723,734, as against \$641,222 in the previous year. This represents 52c a share. Adding the Huronian stock asset valued in the balance sheet at \$279,278, the figure per share is 47½c. A change in policy with respect to handling surplus is noted in the balance sheet. Where last year bonds represented the bulk of investments this year there is a sum of \$510,800 listed as secured loans.

R. Home Smith, in his report to shareholders, states: "Your mine and mill were in continuous operation during the year and produced bullion to the value of \$896,397.61, representing a recovery of \$7.91 per ton from 113,329 tons milled. The cost of production amounted to \$543,797.44 or \$4.80 per ton milled, as against \$5.15 per ton in the previous year."

"The operating profit for the year under review (before allowing for depreciation and writing off other charges) amounted to \$385,974.35, as against \$300,544.14 during the previous year. The net current assets of your company, not including the subscription of \$250,000 to Huronian Mining and Finance Company, Limited, amounted to \$723,734.09, as against \$641,222.02 in the previous year."

"Other assets owned by your company, including 300,000 shares of Huronian Mining and Finance Company, Limited, are a three-quarter interest in the six Ridgely claims, which adjoin the Conlaureum Mine, and 889,612 shares of Inspiration Gold Mines Limited, out of a total issued capital of 1,150,000 shares."

Comparison with July 31st, 1929, shows the progress made during the year. Assets, Current: Cash, Bonds, Bullion, Accounts Receivable, Supplies, Loans (secured), Liabilities, Profit and Loss Account: Expenditures written off, Depreciation, Taxes, Surplus.

R. E. Dye, mine manager, in his report, states: "Results of exploration and development work done during the year just ended have been generally favourable, having resulted in a net improvement in the ore reserves position after allowing for the ore extracted during the year. The improvement mentioned has resulted in the main from further development of known lenses, notable contributions toward this having been secured in the old 5-8 system, the 709 drift area and in the 426 drift area."

"The orebody discovered late last year in the northern part of the property at the 400-foot level (426 drift) has since been proved to extend to the 500-foot level and a search for a further downward extension is now being made at the 600-foot level and at the 733-foot level. In addition to the ore found in 426 drift, other smaller lenses have been found at the same horizon (427 and 409) which lead to the belief that further work along the shear zone crossing this section of the property may result in other productive discoveries."

"The 810 crosscut, at the 896-foot level has reached the porphyry contact on the Krist claim. While no ore has been located in this section, indications are not discouraging and the area is considered worthy of further exploration. The mill operated continuously during the year, and the following data will indicate the results obtained: Tons milled, Average value per ton, Gross value, Bullion recovered, Average running time, Cost of production was \$4.80 per ton."

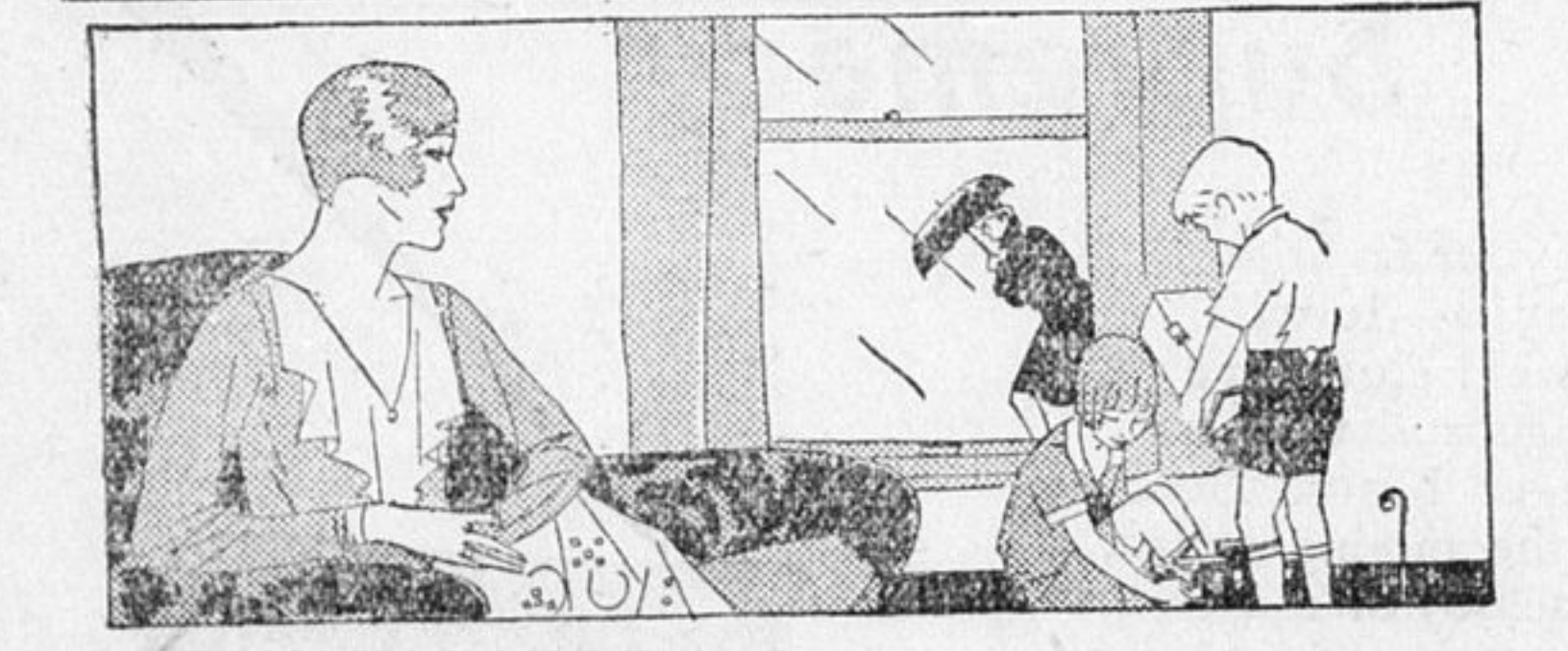
