

**SUBURY SCHOOL BOARD AT SUDBURY FOR DAMAGES**

An unusual case of damages appears to be likely to be started at Sudbury where E. Melleur says he intends to sue the high school board of that city for \$1,500.00 for damages alleged to have been entailed by injuries to his son during an initiation ceremony or performance held by the pupils of the Sudbury high school last September. Whether the high school board is legal-

ly responsible for such injuries remains to be decided. The Sudbury high school board at the present time declines to assume any liability in the matter, and in this they have the support of their solicitor. The fact remains, however, that some one should see that the proper teaching staff is secured and maintained and the proper teaching staff should see to it that the proper discipline is held among the pupils. It is not reasonable that the health or safety of pupils should be

menaced by the tricks of any young hoodlums in any school. It is a matter of common knowledge that in some colleges the initiation ceremonies are a danger at times to the safety of the unfortunate new students and always they are a pain to the comfort and dignity of the stagers. It should be remembered that the people in general undergo considerable hardship to maintain schools and colleges. In a great many cases pupils are sent to these schools and colleges by parents who

cheerfully sacrifice comforts and pleasures to give this opportunity to their youngsters. It looks like poor sportsmanship for the youngsters to waste their time in rowdiness, and when this rowdiness takes the form of serious injury to some of the pupils it is about time that someone responsible, directly or indirectly, was forced to pay damages. If a few of the victims collected damages in such cases, there would soon be a way found to lessen or stop this idiotic form of smart-aleckism.
