QUEBEC BOARD OF TRADE FAVOURS HIGHWAY ROUTE

Under the heading of "Transcontinental Highway," the annual report of the Quebec City board of trade has the following paragraphs that will no doubt be read with interest in this North Land:—

"The matter of a transcontinental highway was discussed during the convention of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce and two routes have been proposed for this transcontinental highway, the southern route via the North shore of Lake Ontario and Sudbury, and the Northern route via Abitibi and Northern Ontario districts.

"In the interests of Quebec, of the province, and of the country in general the council is of the opinion that the northern route would be the most profitable connecting the colonization district of Abitibi and the clay belt of Ontario.

"The council has requested your president to interview Hon. J. E. Perrault, Minister of Roads, to explain the advantages of such a route through the northern section of the province."
