### SUDBURY DISTRICT MAN GIVEN PENITENTIARY TERM

Two years in the Portsmouth penitentiary was the sentence imposed on Monday at Sudbury by Judge Proulx on M. Coldberg had been secretarytreasurer of the school board in question for several terms and the charges against him arose from alleged irregularities in connection with the funds of the board. It was held that during the month of February that Coldberg improperly cashed three cheques, the funds for these cheques being drawn from the school section account.
