Reference is made also to the fact that standardization has been adopted by leading players and teachers of bridge. It is a development that has been forced by the contract players of the United States, of Canada, of Great Britain and of the world Once they have understood the simplicity and accuracy of the Culbertson Standard system, their acceptance of its principles as a guide to contract bidding has been well nigh universal." 
