

### ON CARROTS IN CANADA

One form of Red Russian invasion has already reached Canada according the same. Several weeks ago reporters pleted airship ready for its initial flight to information sent out by the Domin-

"Some curiously interesting facts are North Land. These two young men a North Land airship made by a North associated with the work of the Entomological Branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture and among these is included the steady spread to the West and South of the carrot rust fly (Psila Rosae Fab.). This insect is of European origin, having been first described many years ago from Bessarabia in southwestern Russia. It has been a serious vegetable pest in Northern Europe for a long period, and has been known in Eastern Canada for nearly half a century. It is spreading slowly west and south and in Canada has reached the Lake Superior region. It is one of the most difficult of soilinhabiting insects to control and has been the subject of study on two continents for years. There are two generations of these flies each year and injury to the carrot crop is caused by the maggots from the eggs laid by these flies, which bore into the young carrot early in June and again into the more mature root early in October. Two methods of control are found useful. First the cultural method of late planting so that seedings do not appear above ground before June 10, and of early harvesting, before September 15, The second method of control is the application of corrosive sublimate as an insecticide applied at the time of egg laying in the life cycle of the fly. The solution used is one ounce to ten gallons of water. This mixture is used to thoroughly saturate the soil around the voung seedlings."

The money was chiefly desired to carry on the medical comforts depot in town which has proved of so much advantage and value to the people. The St. John Ambulance Brigade in its medical comforts depot supplies needed articles for the home in case of illness, the articles being loaned to the homes on the recommendation of any of the local doctors. These medical comforts include nearly everything needed for home nursing from hot water bags to cots and crutches. People in general, perhaps, do not realize the value to the town of this medical comforts service, but like the other services of the St. John Ambulance Brigade it is of great benefit to many here.

The ladies selling the flags on Saturday were active and energetic and did their work well and deserve commendation for the successful effort given to this good cause.


