On Thursday, January 28th, the community was shocked as the news spread that "Jock" Robertson had passed away at the Porcupine hospital after less than two hours' illness. He had taken a chill and as a severe cold seemed to be developing he was brought out to the hospital for treatment but his heart gave out. The late Mr. Robertson was born forty-one years ago in Tillicoultry, Scotland, and came to Canada twenty years ago. It is nearly thirteen years since he first came to the Porcupine camp as an employee of the Dome Mines and he has been a respected resident there ever since, the last year being spent at the power house on Porcupine Lake. He organized the first football team at the Dome and for twelve years was manager of their football team, during which some worth-while football was produced. He took an active interest in educational and public affairs. Along with Lieut .-Col. Geo. Cole, he was one of the first directors of the Porcupine-Dome library. The funeral was held on Sunday at the United Church and was very largely attended by people from every walk in life. The Masonic Lodge of South Porcupine attended in a body and held their Masonic rites for the dead after the preaching of the funeral sermon by Rev. L. Hussey. Mr. Robertson was a member of Ben Cluach Lodge in Scotland. Mrs. Christie feelingly sang "Abide with Me" during the service. Interment took place in the South Porcupine cemetery, the pallbearers being Messrs F. C. Evans, C. McInnis, J. Jordan, J. Armstrong, P. Andrew and Sharp. A long entourage of cars followed to the last resting place of their friend and neighbour. He leaves to mourn his loss his widow, Helma Lahti, to whom he was married seventcen years ago, and their four children, Peter, aged fourteen years, Buddy aged twelve, Agnes eleven and Alice nine years.
