FIVE TO JAIL FROM THIS WEEK'S POLICE COURT HERE

A total of five will see jail as a result of the police court here this week. These will include a couple of drunks who could not pay the required fine, one of these being a second offender who was taxed \$50.00 and costs. There were eight common drunks, each being assessed \$10.00 and costs. A young fellow between sixteen and seventeen also missed jail by a small margin. He was caught stealing money from the office of Dr. L. S. Honey. On account of his youth and the fact that it was the first time he had been in trouble with the law, the lad was allowed to go on suspended sentence, after restitution had been made by members of the family. The magistrate gave the young fellow a stern lecture on the evil of his way. The dental offices of Dr. Honey are sometimes left open at noon and at six while the doctor is at home. Recently money had been missed on more than one occasion from the cash box and the police arranged a trap to catch the thief last week. One of the officers remained hidden in the building and though the first time nothing happened, on Saturday evening the sixteen-year-old lad walked into the trap and was caught with the marked money in his possession.
