### Urge Highway Jobs Kept up to Give Work

Meeting at North Bay Suggests Ways and Means of Bringing Relief Highway and "Back to the Land" Suggested.

According to despatches from North Bay on Thursday of last week, at the request of Mayor J. W. Richardson, members of the city council, clergymen and representatives of various civic organizations met to discuss the local unemployment situation. The mayor who acted as the chairman, pointed out the seriousness of the situation. In his opinion it would be much more acute as the months passed.

The proposition had now reached the stage that the city council were alone unable to fully meet it and he asked the co-operation of all citizens. After a lengthy discussion covering various phases the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

#### Would Continue Highway

That the city council be requested to urge upon the Dominion and Provincial Governments the continuation of the trans-Canada highway with the reopening of the camps as soon as possible, also undertaking of Temiskaming highway and construction of spillways at French River as necessary important public works to help meet the growing unemployment in this section with the attendant distress and dangers.

And that the Governments be advised that the citizens of North Bay intend to supplement direct relief efforts by further campaign for local subscriptions.

That the Government, Federal and provincial, be urged to at once develop a scheme of land settlement as an unemployment relief measure with necessary assistance provided during the early periods of settlement under proper supervision and with the appointment at once of committees in each district to carefully survey needs and possibilities.

#### Single Men Organizing

Addressing some 200 unemployed single men who gathered at Wallace Park this morning, Mayor Richardson advised them to form themselves into an organization.

"At present," the mayor said, "we do not know how many single men are unemployed. If you organize, should relief work be available, we shall be able to get in touch with you at short notice."

The mayor said that he expected Hon. Mr. Finlayson would be here shortly to confer with civic officials regarding unemployment.

The meeting was quite orderly and the mayor was given a good hearing and the assurance that they were not tainted with "anything red." All they wanted, they said, was some measure of employment.

At the registration bureau at the North Bay city hall 285 unemployed single men have registered.

### REV. JOHN MANUEL GOES TO CHURCH IN EAST TORONTO

Rev. John Manuel, who is well known in the town and district, having been stationed as a student missionary at Connaught some years ago, is leaving Kapuskasing, where he has been the pastor of the United Church for the past two years. Rev. Mr. Manuel is going to Hope Church, East Toronto, as minister there. Rev. and Mrs. Manuel were very popular and highly regarded in Kapuskasing and their departure from that town is greatly regretted. Rev. Mr. Manuel's place at Kapuskasing is being taken by Rev. Geo. Service, previously at the Carlton Street United Church, Toronto.

### Took Chunk of Ice from Under the Charlton Road

References made in past years to frost in the roads well on in the summer has always created some interest and has tended at times to argument. One man in authority, who has had connection with roads in this country for a long term of years, once said that there was frost in some of the roads all the year round. Some people wanted to mob him, but other knew there was much in what he said. With the excellent roads in most parts of the North, especially on the Ferguson highway, it may be hard to believe that frost plays a part in other roads even in the summer time, but against this it should be remembered that roads in this country have to be really built. It isn't a question of cutting a right of way; it means more than just grading, or even graveling. All this is proven by the experience of the Ferguson highway. This year it might be thought that well on in June, with the weather so dry and warm, there would not be any frost. The genial H. W. Weeks, of Englehart, who looks after Northern Development work in that district as one of the many lines of his public activity, recently found frost in the Charlton road. He did not leave it to the public to believe him if he simply said so. Instead he brought in to Englehart last week a chunk of ice that he had found about a foot and a half below the surface of the Charlton road. The ice was there for all to see, while it lasted. Of course, it did not last long after being dug from that road while some repairs were being made, but it did hold together long enough for several citizens to see it and thus be able to bear out Mr. Weeks' story. Mr. Weeks is quoted as saying that the frost is not out of certain parts of the road by a long shot. Mr. Weeks and the other road men in the North deserve credit for the excellent condition of the roads in view of the difficulties that have to be overcome in so many ways.

### CONDITIONS AT HEARST SAID TO BE EXAGGERATED

The Northern Tribune, of Kapuskasing, suggests that the stories sent out in regard to conditions at Hearst are somewhat exaggerated. The Northern Tribune blames these stories on the Wolf Town, Sault Ste. Marie. Anything that comes out of the Sault is sure to be exaggerated and the grain of truth obscured by fiction. However, it may be noted that most people here have been taking their ideas of conditions in Hearst from the correspondence sent from Hearst by The Northern Tribune's own correspondent there. There is nothing sensational about the way the case has been dealt with by the Hearst correspondent, but the facts themselves are what are sensational. There is no exaggeration in this case by the Hearst writer, but the facts as briefly outlined are, to say the least, startling. For instance, it is a matter of record that the transients at Hearst, practically all foreigners,

threatened to loot the stores unless they were given food, clothing, or money. It is also a matter of record that the provincial government sent \$500.00 and this grant was no sooner received than there was a demand for another \$500.00. The second \$500.00 being given by the government there following a demand for still further relief money. All the way through there has been the threat of looting the stores held out. This is all surely sensational enough. No matter what The Sault Star may say about the conditions at Hearst, it is difficult to see how the tall stories can be more disturbing than the plain truth.
