At the council meeting of Tisdale township council on Monday evening Reeve Gallagher and all the councillors were present. There were as usual several cases to be considered. The bill of rental for the building where inquiries are held in Schumacher had not been sent in for four years and was to be asked for. While in court of revision several taxes cases were to be heard. V. Laffin had paid in taxes which had been transferred. Those were credited to another property. A man with a poolroom on First avenue Schumacher, found out it was "No Picnic," when he wanted his taxes lowered. Another man with a rooming house on First avenue complained that his revenue was lowered, now that so many rooming houses had been built on Second avenue. His taxes were also confirmed. But it was realized by the council that Second avenue west, in Schumacher, was now practically a business section and would have to be assessed accordingly. Many of the so-called boarding houses there were really hotels doing business on a larger scale than some of the First avenue hotels. It looked as though people had gone into these areas of lower assessment and were carrying on business the same as in the original business section. McIntyre road was reported by the engineer to be practically finished except for the placing of a few loads of fine gravel to make a suitable walk for pedestrians. The council all agreed that the road at present most urgently needing repair was the Dome road. A short spell of warm weather would allow this to be done much more efficiently for the type of repairing needed but it is to be started within the week. The portion from the railway crossing to town is to receive special attention for repairs. At Gilles Lake the better half of the work is now done but it was thought advisable to change the road bed along Toke street so that traffic would not be immediately over the water line as it has been in the past. The Conlaun road and culvert were also discussed. Gold Centre lights are still delayed owing to no clear understanding as to where poles can be placed.

In a week-end game of softball between Golden City and South Porcupine, Golden City won 9 to 6 from the boys of this end of the lake.
