Drastic Changes Would be Worse Than Foolish

There is a broad and fair editorial in the last issue of The Hanna Herald, of Hanna, Alberta. While there will be some points in the editorial with which some people will not agree, the main thought of the editorial, that talk of revolution and drastic changes in the ways of life, are foolish and worse. There should also be special notice to the thought that Canadians are not given to revolutionary acts; it is against all their characteristics. Much of the talk along this line is thoughtless and ill-considered and those who use it do not mean it at all. In that very fact lies one of the serious dangers of the times. There are certain people who talk and agree with the foreign agitators and their dupes. This agreement is only a silly pose but it encourages the alien agitators who think they have it all their own way. They go farther than they might otherwise and the result is evil indeed for all concerned.

The editorial in The Hanna Herald is as follows:—

"The attitude of most people these days is in favor of a change. Few know what they want but they want a change. They are determined on that point.

"We also want a change. But we realize that it is exceedingly difficult to bring about a change. And we are doubtful if many realize the possibilities for evil of a change in the wrong direction.

"The capitalistic system is done, we are told. We agree, to an extent. It has developed abuses which have brought about social injustice. It has proven unsatisfactory in many ways, one notable one being the continual upward and downward swings, which

follow each other. This shows lack of stability.

"But what system is to be adopted? What are we going to substitute for the present system? That is a question that must first be decided. We must know where we are going before

we get too far along the way.

"If humanity is launched into a wild-catch scheme of existence it would be an exceedingly serious thing for everybody. Conditions are bad now but they could be worse. Don't forget that! "Russia's change involved chaos and

suffering which is very present yet, even although the revolution is over fifteen years old. Many, many lost their lives in the processes of revolution in that country. Industry was upset and is only now slowly and painfully hobbling back.

"These are things that must carefully be considered before any drastic change is undertaken. The dislocation of a system is an exceedingly delicate and serious operation. Many who talk change and revolution would be among the first to hold protests once their

own toes were tramped on.

"We do not for a moment contemplate any revolutionary change in the present system. At heart our people are too conservative although few will admit it. They do a lot of talking of revolution but know in their own

hearts that they would oppose any really drastic steps.

"We would like to see a new and much different system of working and living. But we have yet to see a concrete plan presented which has any great appeal."
