Bankers Praise the New Curbs on Frauds

Amendments to Ontario Securities Act and New Regulations in Regard to Sale of Stock Endorsed by Investment Bankers.

The Investment Bankers' Association is in favour of the new regulations of the Security Frauds Prevention Act. In a bulletin commenting on the regulations the association comments:—"New regulations have recently been introduced under the Ontario Securities Act. One of the most important regulations has to do with the restrictions placed on house canvassing by security salesmen, except when selling government or municipal bonds."

"The Investment Bankers' Association of Canada (Central District), after carefully considering these regulations, have heartily approved of their adoption and believe that if rigidly enforced they will go a long way toward protecting the investing public. The association believe the time has come when a definite stand should be taken and a strong influence exerted in the movement against fraudulent securities and the manner in which they are foisted on the public."

"The way in which the inexperienced investing public have been induced during the past 10 years to part with high grade bonds in exchange for securities of questionable value, should bring to the mind of every right thinking citizen the realization that the regulations enacted by the Ontario Securities Commission are essential. Had this legislation been passed a number of years ago it would probably have saved the public many millions of dollars. The act is in the interests of the province as a whole, and if given a fair trial and properly enforced it should go a long way toward stamping out the "fly-by-night" and "high pressure" salesmen. The activities of such salesmen

must be curbed regardless of whether they are working for their own account or for others. The Securities Act is good legislation and the department is entitled to the support not only of the investing public but of all security dealers in Ontario."

No Separate French Address for the Governor-General

Some Sudbury citizens had planned to present a separate French address to the Governor-General on his visit to Sudbury, but this plan was vetoed by the Governor-General himself, on the plea that the proper address of welcome to any town or city should come from the mayor, and if this principle were once put aside confusion would naturally result, and there would be too many sections making addresses to the Governor-General. After some Sudbury people had suggested the idea of a separate address in French, A. Lascelles, secretary to the Governor-General wrote to Sudbury as follows:—

"Though His Excellency sincerely appreciates the desire of the French-speaking citizens of Sudbury to present him with an address when he visits your city, he regrets it is not possible for him to receive such an address."

"The mayor of any city or town is the elected representative of all the citizens and it is on their behalf that the mayor welcomes the Governor-General in his civic address; if the Governor-General were to set this principle aside and accept separate addresses from various sections of the community in any one place, the significance of the mayor's welcome would be destroyed, and moreover, there are many cities in the Dominion where quite a number of such sections would claim the right to address the Governor-General independently."

"In the province of Quebec, it is customary for the mayor to read a French translation of his address after he has read the original in English, and though, I know of no instance of this practice in any other province, there would be no objection to it being adopted in Sudbury if you think fit. The French version of your address could be read by any French speaking member of your council, but it must be a translation of your address, and not a separate address."

EIGHT-YEAR-OLD COBALT BOY DROWNED WHILE FISHING

The Halleyburian last week says:—"The first drowning accident this season in this district was reported at Cobalt on Tuesday night, the victim being eight-year-old Guillaume Clouthier, son of Mrs. Mary Clouthier, who lost his life in Short Lake, south of the town while fishing. The boy apparently slipped off the dam at the north end of the lake, and he had been in the water probably a half hour when three lads who had gone there to net minnows saw his body floating among some moss.
