## Railway Conductor Committed for Trial

T. & N. O. Conductor Charged with Theft of 14 Cases of Liquor Now on \$5,000.00 Bail Awaiting Trial by Judge.

At Englehart on Monday, Magistrate Atkinson committed Harold Smith, T. & N. O. conductor, recently employed as spare brakeman, to stand trial on the charge of stealing 14 cases of liquor en route from Toronto to Kapuskasing. The charge had been laid on instructions from the Ontario Liquor Commission. Smith was allowed bail in the amount of \$5,000.00.

According to the evidence at the preliminary trial, six of the cases alleged to be part of the consignment stolen were found on the farm of Victor Poulin, about a mile and a half from Englehart. Poulin said the stuff had been claimed by Smith and Cleve Leonard, T. & N. O. engineer, on the evening of July 25th, after it had been found in a small bush on his property. According to Eldon Westman, Englehart hotel-keeper, he had paid Smith for three cases of whiskey at the rate of \$30.00 per case. He claimed that Smith had asked him for the order and had represented that he had a special permit to bring in liquor from Montreal. Robt. Swan, T. & N. O. investigator, swore that he found seals in Smith's house and these seals were ones the T. & N. O. had supplied to van 88 in 1929 and which should have been left in the van. Employees of the Liquor Control Board, the Canadian National Railway and the T. & N. O., told of having checked the car at Toronto, North Bay, Englehart, Porcupine Junction and Kapuskasing. The car was short 14 cases when it reached Kapuskasing, and Frank Napp at Forquiss Junction reported that one seal had been tampered with when he examined it there, the seal having been placed inside out on the hamp. A warrant is out for the arrest of Leonard who is believed to be in the United States. Smith pleaded not guilty to the charge against him at the preliminary hearing.
