Accordng to Eldon Westman, Englehart hotelkeeper, he had paid Smith for three cases of whiskey at the rate of \$30.00 per case. He claimed that Smith had asked him for the order and had represented that he had a special permit to bring in liquor from Montreal. Robt. Swan, T. & N. O. investigator, swore that he found seals in Smith's house and these seals were ones the T. & N. O. had supplied to van 88 in 1929 and which should have been left in the van. Employees of the Liquor Control Board, the Canadian National Railway and the T. & N. O. told of having shecked the car at Toronto, North Bay, Englehart, Porquis Junction and Kabuskasing. The car was short 14 cases when it reached Kapuskasing, and Frank Napp at Forquis Junction reported that one seal had been tampered with when he examined it there, the eal having been placed inside out on the hasp. A warrant is out for the arrest of Leonard who is believed to be n the United States. Smith pleaded not guilty to the charge against him at the preliminary hearing.
