TIMMINS KIWANIS CLUB FOURTH IN JUNE ATTENDANCE

The current issue of K-Ray, the official Kiwanis magazine, gives the attendance record for June for the Timmins club in the Ontario-Quebec-Maritimes district. Out of a total of 46 clubs in the area, Timmins club for June stands fourth for attendance. In the whole district the average attendance percentage was given as 66.16 per cent. There are only five clubs with eighty per cent or more. These are the following clubs, in the order given: Noranda, 85.4; Orillia, 86; St. John, N.B., 83.96; Owen Sound, 82; Timmins, 81.48. Kirkland Lake is a close sixth with a percentage of 79.17. Cobalt is materially down, having only a percentage of 30. New Liskeard has 68.02. Toronto is down to 58. Sault Ste. Marie has 66.92.

Open Seasons, Bag Limits, Etc. for Duck, Geese and Woodcock

Provisions of the Migratory Birds Act for 1933. Regulations Governing the Killing of Wild Ducks, Geese, Brant, Rails, Coots, Wilson's or Jack-snipe, Etc. Closed Seasons on Certain Birds. Other Details of Act.

The National Parks Service of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, has just issued the regulations regarding Migratory Birds for the current year.

A summary of the regulations as they apply to Ontario follows:— Open Season—Ducks, Geese, Brant, Rails, Coots and Wilson's or Jack-Snipe.

In that part of Ontario lying north and west of the French and Mattawa Rivers and also including all Georgian Bay waters—September 1 to December 15.

In that part of Ontario lying south of the French and Mattawa Rivers (but not including any portion of the Georgian Bay waters)—September 15 to December 15.

Open Season—Elder Ducks North of the Quebec, Cochrane, Winnipeg line of the Canadian National Railways—September 1 to December 15. Open Season—Woodcock September 15th to November 30.

Closed Season There is a closed season throughout the year on Wood Ducks, Swans, Cranes, Curlew, Willets, Godwits, Upland Plover, Black-bellied and Golden Plover, Greater and Lesser Yellow-legs, Avocets, Dowitchers, Knots, Oystercatchers, Phalaropes, Stilts, Surf-birds, Turnstones and all the shore birds not provided with an open season in above schedule.

There is a closed season throughout the year on the following non-game birds:— Auks, Auklets, Bitterns, Fulmars, Gannets, Grebes, Guillemots, Gulls, Herons, Jaegers, Loons, Murres, Petrels, Puffins, Shearwaters and Terns; and there is a closed season throughout the year on the following insectivorous birds: Bobolinks, Catbirds, Chickadees, Cuckoos, Flickers, Flycatchers, Grosbeaks, Hummingbirds, Kinglets, Martins, Meadowlarks, Nighthawks or Bull-bats, Nuthatches, Orioles, Robins, Shrikes, Swallows, Swifts, Tanagers, Titmice, Thrushes, Vireos, Warblers, Waxwings, Whip-poor-wills, Woodpeckers, and Wrens, and all other perching birds which feed entirely or chiefly on insects.

No person shall kill, hunt, capture, injure, take or molest any migratory game birds during the closed season; and no person shall sell, expose for sale, offer for sale, buy, trade or traffic in any migratory game bird at any time.

The taking of the nests or eggs of migratory game, migratory insectivorous and migratory non-game birds, their nests or eggs is prohibited.

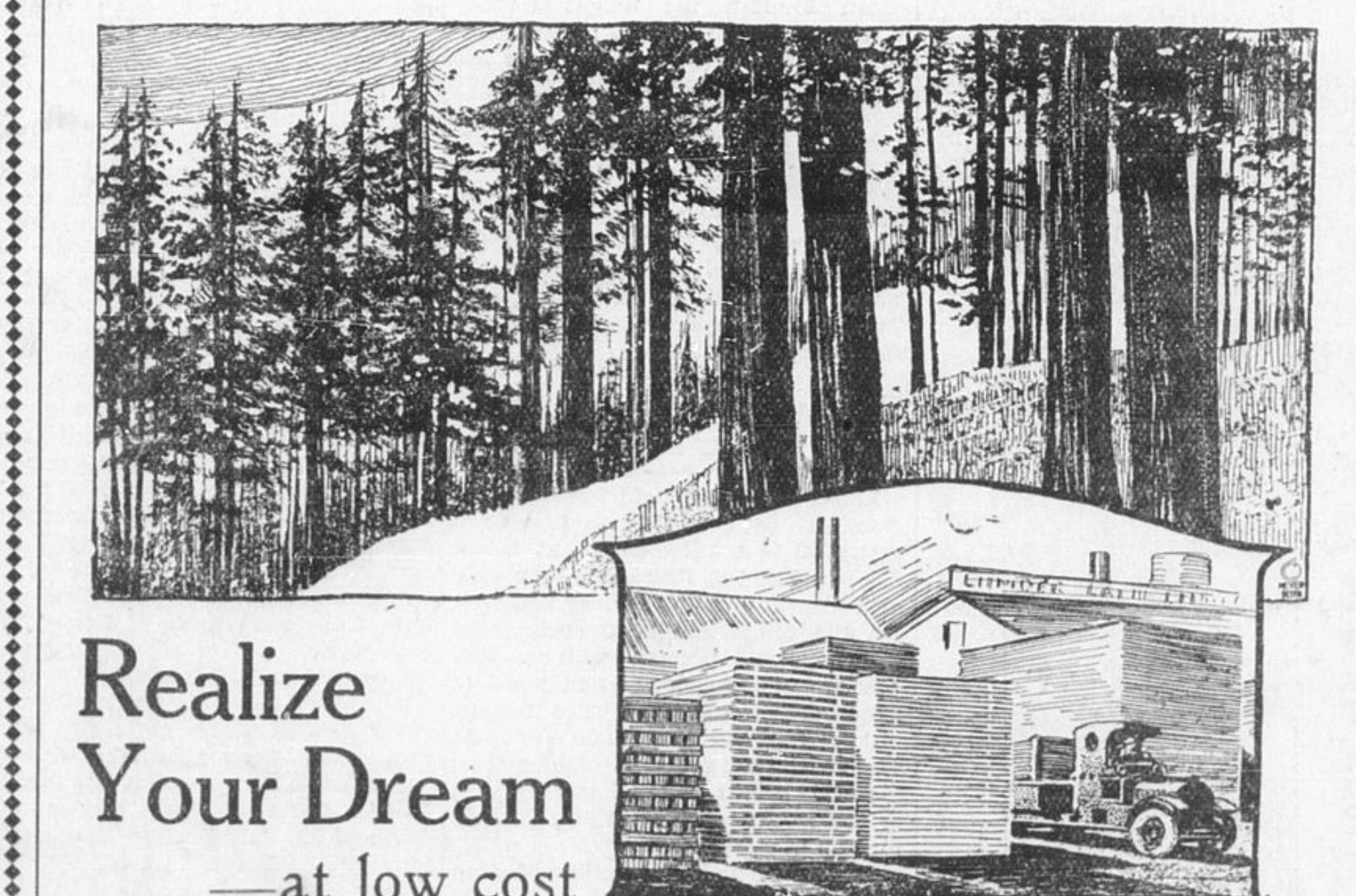
