Six Months Term for Breach of Morality

Man Living on Avails of Immoral Living Given Term in Jail. Large Variety of Charges at Police Court Here This Week.

At police court here this week a man giving the name of Paul Marcotte and his address as Cedar street, south, was charged with living on the avails of prostitution. The chief witness against him was a woman who admitted that she had been supporting him for some time past. He was found guilty and sentenced to six months in jail. The charge of immoral living preferred against the woman in the case was withdrawn on the understanding that she change her ways of life and also her town of residence. The fate of the man in this case should be noted by several other men in the town and vicinity, who are living under similar conditions.

James Valliere charged with the theft of tools failed to appear to answer to the charge and a bench warrant was issued for his arrest.

Laura Laroque, Kirby avenue, charged with illegally having liquor, was remanded for a week.

Armand Dalpe, 51½ Maple street, north, was before the court on a charge of high-grading. He was arrested last week, and Sgt. Crank and Special Officer R. Allen are said to have found about four pounds of gold ore in his possession. He pleaded not guilty and elected to be tried by the magistrate. He was remanded to next week, being allowed out on \$2500.00 bail.

A charge of theft against a local man was withdrawn by the complainant with costs paid.

A common assault case was remanded to next week. Another common assault case was withdrawn.

A woman accused her husband of common assault but the case was dismissed after the evidence in the case showed that she had used a broom handle on her husband.

A man living on Spruce street, south, was charged with assaulting an acquaintance. The latter is still in the hospital so the case was adjourned for a week.

The magistrate dismissed the charge against a Balsam street man accused of failing to provide for his wife and family.

Six speeders were each fined \$10.00 and costs. Another speeding charge was withdrawn.

There were six charged with the ordinary everyday drunkenness. Five of them were assessed \$10.00 and costs. The sixth man was fined \$25.00 and costs for drinking in a public place.

One of the drunks by odd coincidence had the same name as one of the town councillors but he wasn't a town councillor nor any relation to any town councillor so far as could be learned, but the councillor may expect to hear considerable "kidding" about the similarity of names.

As announced at the opening of the Canadian Chautauquas at Timmins last week this excellent form of entertainment will not be available at Timmins next year, the present conditions making it necessary to avoid sections where there is too large a distance between the Chautauquas without a deficit.

However, though the North will not be visited next year by the Chautauquas and Timmins will accordingly miss this event, it has been definitely decided to have the Chautauquas here the following year, 1935. Before the Chautauquas superintendent, Miss Grover, left Timmins this week she had signed up a sufficient number of sponsors to guarantee the visit of the Chautauquas to Timmins in 1935. It may be a long time to look forward but many here with whom the Chautauquas are popular will be keenly interested and pleased to know that even though next year is missed the Chautauquas will be here the following year.

Trouble in Sault District With Incendiary Bush Fires

A series of serious incendiary fires, in addition to many bush conflagrations, is adding to the worries of the forestry branch at Sault Ste. Marie.

Five incendiary blazes, all close together and being held by rangers, were started in Aberdeen township, and several blazes attributed to bush firebugs have started near Lake Laumon in the Blind River area. Already 1,000 acres have been burned over.

"We have stopped and controlled this fire on several occasions," Chief Forester N. M. Kensit said to-day. "But it invariably breaks out again beyond the fire lines. We had it stopped at the east end yesterday, and last night someone started another fire half a mile beyond it in the bush. Steps are being taken to secure convictions," he said.

The forestry department has insisted the township of Plummer take action on a fire of some extent there which has now burned over several hundred acres.

Several new fires are reported to-day. One in Parkinson is burning over a cut, two small fires started in Striker township and other fires were burning in several organized townships. A heavy pall of smoke hangs over the whole district to-day, making visibility for the air patrol and tovers almost negligible.
