### Here is a Tested Recipe for Making Iced Tea

Use 6 heaping teaspoons of "Salada" Black Tea. Brew tea in one pint of freshly boiled water for six minutes. Strain, and pour liquid into a two-quart container. While hot, add 1-2 cups of granulated sugar and juice of 2 lemons. Then shake or stir contents well, until sugar is fully dissolved. Fill container with cold water. DO NOT ALLOW TEA TO COOL BEFORE ADDING THE COLD WATER; otherwise, liquid will become cloudy. This is now ready to serve in tall glasses with chipped ice or cubes. A slice of lemon may be added if desired. The above will make two quarts of iced tea, or seven tall glasses.

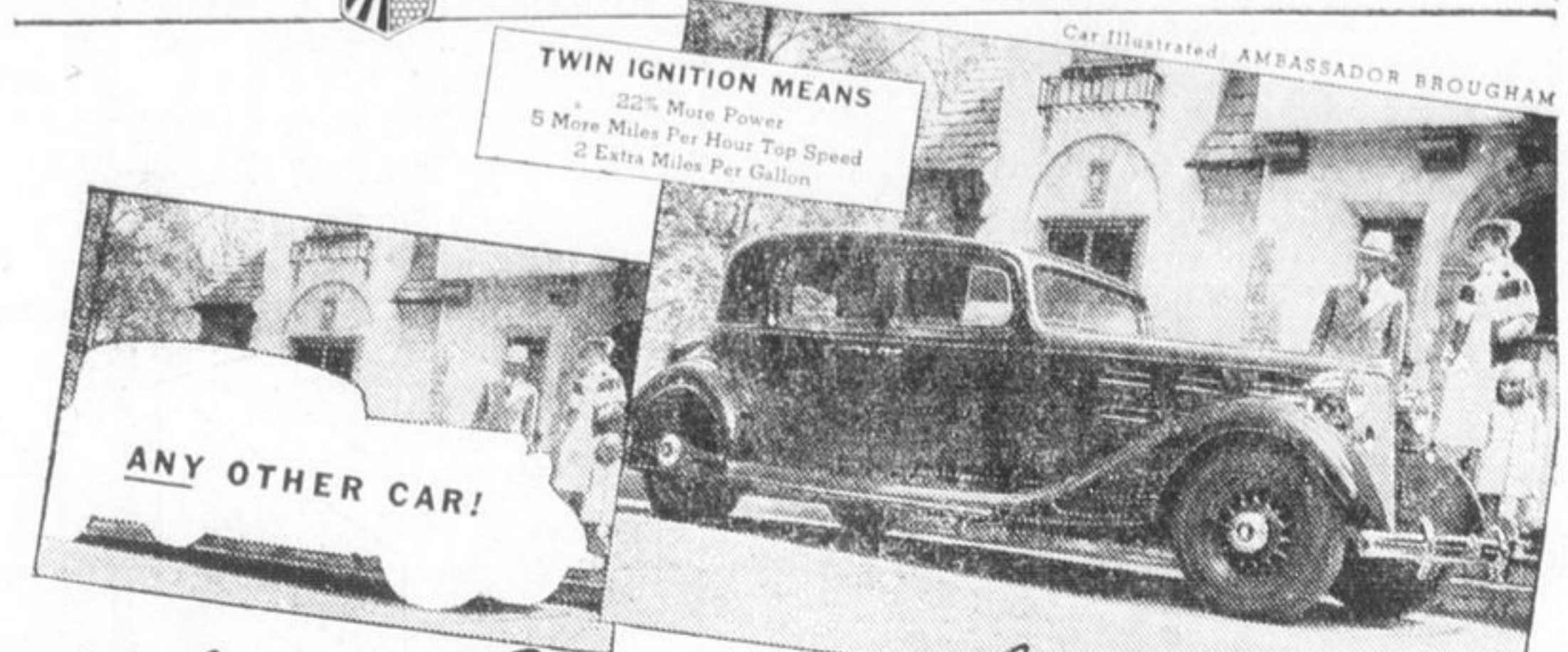
