

Liberals Sweep Province in Provincial Election

Wire at 11.49 Says 64 Liberals Elected; Conservatives 13; Independents, 1; C.C.F., 1; U.F.O., 1. Ten Seats to be Heard from. The Most Sweeping Defeat Given Henry Government. Most of Cabinet Defeated.

The latest wire from Toronto gives the news that the Conservatives were very badly defeated in the province, only 13 seats being held by them, while the Liberals have 64 with only ten seats to hear from.

Hon. George Henry was elected, but Hon. W. G. Martin, Hon. Paul Poisson, Hon. T. L. Kennedy, and Hon. Wm. Finlayson all met defeat. The Hon. Chas. McCrea's riding is in doubt, with the Liberal (Mr. Lapierre) leading.

In Cochrane South A. F. Kenning was defeated, John Rowlandson winning by what is conceded to be a fair majority.

In the riding up to 11 a.m. Rowlandson had a total of 5662 votes, while Kenning's votes were placed at 3840. Alex M. Stewart, the C.C.F. candidate, had 2470 votes.

In Timmins the total vote, with three polls to hear from was:—Kenning, 2600; Lehtinen, 394; Ogilvie, 54; Paquette 197; Rowlandson, 3572; Stewart, 1406.


Troquois Falls gave Stewart 185 votes; Rowlandson, 181; and Kenning, 149.

In Kirkland Lake Kenning's vote (with three polls to hear from) was 1240; Rowlandson, 2090; Stewart, 1064. The other candidates received only small votes.
