**DEER SAID TO BE DYING FROM WORMS IN THE HEAD**

Following a report from the Mattawa area that deer are dying there as the result of bugs burrowing through their heads, a check-up of the Sudbury district situation reveals that about eight or ten deer are dead in Goschen township from what may be a similar cause. Deer are also reported dead at Metagami Lake, north of Lake Wahnapitae. Game Warden J. Mulligan said the deaths might have been caused by a similar pest to that in the Mattawa district. He said he understood that sheep are occasionally attacked by such an insect in the spring. An official of the Game and Fisheries Department may be sent here to investigate.

**Slips on Bank, Scrapes Moss and Discovers Gold**

Advices to The Sudbury Star from Elsas last week are to the effect that a group of claims south of the find recently reported by Bill Robillard in that area has been staked by Ralph T. Corfield, Toronto, in company with three companions. They are said to have good gold showings.

Corfield and his associates, it is stated, were on their way to Port Arthur and met Robillard on the same train, returning to Elsas from Toronto. They got off at Outland, a few miles south of Elsas, with Robillard, examined the discovery of the latter, and then proceeded three miles to the southwest.

The story goes that Corfield slipped on a mossy bank and fell, at the same time saying, "I suppose I will break my neck and maybe you will make your fortunes here."

The party scraped off the moss where Corfield fell, broke some of the rock and saw before their eyes tiny specks of gold. They proceeded to do further stripping and revealed a wide mineralized vein. Samples brought out to Elsas are said to have showed free gold. The Corfield party have returned to Toronto.

Ralph Corfield has done considerable prospecting in other fields. He was born in England and went to Vancouver Island in 1911. When the war broke out he joined the Imperial field artillery and was wounded three times in action. On demobilization in 1919 he went to the Argentine and prospected on the western slopes of the Andes. He returned to Canada in 1920, and prospected on the Findlay and Laird Rivers, B.C. In 1922 he found placer gold on the Laird. He went to the Baker Lakes district, Northwest Territories, and later prospected in Churchill River, B.C. In 1927 he staked at Rottenstone Lake, in Saskatchewan, and in 1929 he returned to England, where he was married. Coming again to Canada, he took up silver fox farming near Madoc.

To the east of the Robillard holdings it is reported that the Garvey brothers have staked a group of claims. The Garveys have been active in the Matachewan and other fields.

Robillard states that extensive exploration work will be undertaken on his claims within the next two weeks.
