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## McIntyre Bail Team Wins the Second in T. B. L. Series, 7 to 3

Chambers worked hard for the Macs and went the route, allowing only seven hits. Curry, the Kirkland sensation, blew up and lasted only two and one third innings before he was blasted from the mound. Jelly replacing him pitched another nice game but the damage was already done. For the six innings that he pitched Gar Jelly allowed only two hits, a single by Wood and a double by Cybosky.

Adamson had a little accident in the game when in stopping a bad pitch by Chambers, he split his thumb-nail. It was painful, but he continued the game after repairing it.

Eddie Angrignon made a name for

himself when he snagged Jelly's fly in the ninth. It was a fly to short centre that made Eddie run his fastest to get. He just reached for it and made the most beautiful shoe-string catch ever seen in this part of the country. Incidentally it was the catch that finished the game.

The game started at a fast clip but began to drag after the third. In the first three innings Kirkland scored their three runs and the Macs scored six but no more runs crossed till the Macs registered another one in the seventh.

Kirkland had six men left stranded while McIntyre had five left. One double play was pulled off, Monaghan to Cowden to Cybosky, on Baldwin and Jubenville.

Price, Jubenville and Giovanelli were Kirkland's best hitters with two hits each in four trips. One of Jubenville's smacks was a double to centre field. McIntyre's best was Wood with three singles in four trips. Cybosky had two smacks, both doubles.

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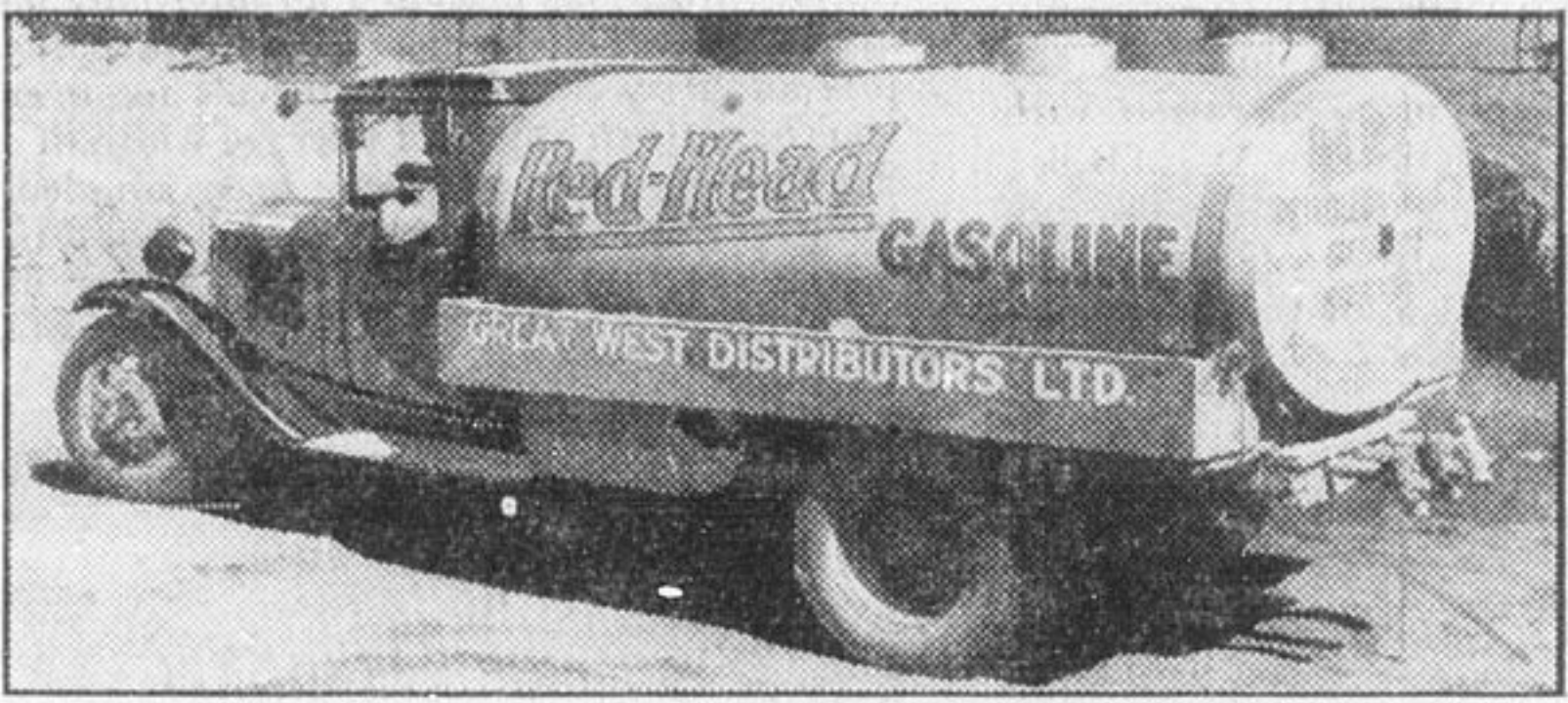
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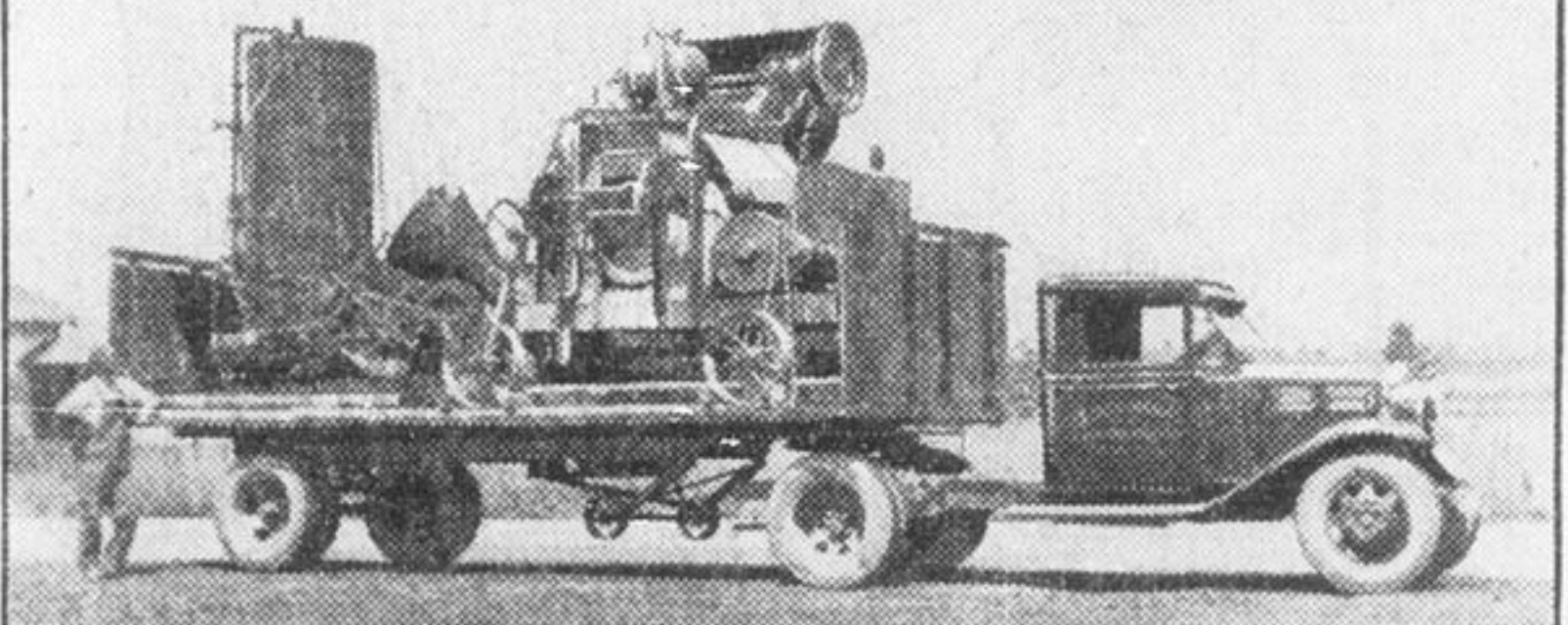
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
