## Another Group of Books Added to Library Here

Plenty of Action in the Non-Fiction Books Just Placed on the Shelves, While the Fiction Includes Mystery, Adventure, Sea Stories, Humour, Etc.

There's plenty of action in the non-fiction class books added to the Timmins Public Library this week.

"SOS to the Rescue," by Karl Baar-slag. (A wireless operator tells the craft's side of famous stories of rescue at sea.)

"An Eastern Odyssey," by George le Fevre, translated and adapted by Major-General Sir E. D. Sivinton.

(Following the approximate route of Marco Polo from Beirut, near Damascus on the Mediterranean Sea, right across Asia—through Persia, Afghanistan, the Pamirs, the Himalayas, the U.S.S.R.—Sinking border, the Gobi desert—to Peking in Northern China. The true story of the 1931-32 expedition that made the journey in caterpillar-wheeled motors.)

"Portuguese Somersault," by Jan and Cora Gordon. (Two visits by the "Vagabond Travellers," who noted many changes in the country in the short space of eight years. A free and easy kind of travel book.)

"Science and Education in the U.S.S.R.," by Professor A. Pinkevich. (The eleventh of a series of books written by Soviet authorities themselves on life, ideas and ideals in the republic.)

"Personal History," by Vincent Sheehan. (Third edition of a work that has made a wide impression. Written by a newspaper reporter who is somewhat of a romanticist, yet whose analysis of

human problems of the present should be of value.)

Fiction included is:—

"Tom Cringle's Log," by Michael Scott. (A fine edition of another sea story by the author of "Moby Dick.")

"Second Officer," by Taffrail. (Modern sea story of pirates who meet a New Zealand-bound ship.)

"Death Watch," by Carr. (Mystery.)

"Murder of My Aunt," by Hall. (A nephew and aunt, who hate each other, try conclusions in a mystery story of a peculiar sort.)

"Blanding's Castle," by P. G. Wodehouse. (Another of the hilarious Wodehouse tales.)

"General Besserley's Puzzle Box," by E. Phillips Oppenheim. (Mystery and intrigue.)

"Resurrection River," by Mowery. (A novel of the far Canadian North, the discovery of gold there and the artfulness of big interests.)

"The Case of the Counterfeit Eye," by Gardner. (Mystery.)

### Local Diving Meet to be Held June 13

Prizes Offered for District Divers in Tank Exhibition at Ball Park.

Amateur divers of the North are to have a chance to show their wares and win some prizes on Thursday, June 13, at Conklin's All-Canadian Shows, which will be at the ball park at that time under the auspices of the Canadian Legion, Timmins Branch 83.

The tank used will be the same one erected for the use of Miss Bench Bentum, whose accomplishments as a swimmer and diver have won her continent-wide fame with the five championships and 24 cups and medals she holds. Associated with her is Jerry O'Brien, who takes a complete back somersault dive from a height of 110 feet into the flaming tank. Miss Arlene Gran of New York does acrobatic dives and Fred Beatty, the well-known water clown will also be on hand.

The diving contests for local and district amateurs won't include any 10 foot dives but nothing is barred in the way of plain or fancy diving. Three distinct groups will be formed with good prizes in all. Contestants will be allowed to choose their own style and competent judges will make the awards. Miss Bentum, Mr. O'Brien, Col. Scobell and Austin Neame will probably choose the winners.

Receive Entries Till Wednesday  
The only qualification necessary for entry is that the divers be over 12 years of age. Applications may be made at the Canadian Legion hall at 7 Cedar street south, or direct to Miss Bentum when the Conklin shows arrive in town. Wednesday, June 12th, is the closing date. Separate classes will be made for men and women.

If you'd like to learn to dive, Miss Bentum has promised to give instruction at the tank every night the show is in town. She'll give practical demonstrations, too.

The high dive into the flaming tank and all the routine at the pool will be a daily feature of the show that will be free to everyone inside the gates of the park.
