## Convention of the W. A. at South End Last Week

Annual Convention of the Women's Auxiliary for the Diocese of Moosonee Held in South Porcupine. News and Notes of the Sessions Held.

## Archdeacon Woodall's Fortieth Anniversary

Ordained in London, England in 1895. Has Had Interesting and Stirring Life. Has Given Much Service to Far North Areas. Congratulations and Good Wishes Being Extended.

South Porcupine, Ont., June 8th, 1936. Special to The Advance.  
A sorry-looking wreck of a LaSalle coupe was brought in from the back road this morning. The driver, "Pat" Andrews, of Feldman's staff, Schumacher, is in St. Mary's hospital with serious injuries sustained when the car turned over several times after striking the ditch on the road between MacDonald Lake and the Vipond Mine road. The accident occurred late last night.

Another accident has just been brought to our notice. On Thursday afternoon when Canon Prewar, and Rural Dean Hesketh, of Chapleau, were driving back to Sudbury after attending the synod in Timmins, they collided with a truck at Forquiss Jet, and were thrown into the ditch. Fortunately they were not badly hurt, and were able to continue their journey later, after their car had been fixed.

Mr. J. Dalton has bought the site of Mr. Percy Richards' burned down garage on Bruce avenue. Mr. Severt of Timmins is busy excavating preparatory to erecting a cement-block two-storey building for Mr. Dalton. A bus-stand, offices, taxistand, etc., is to be built. Building will probably take about two months.

### Boy Scouts in Timmins

Summer camp for Timmins Scouts was the big subject under consideration at the executive meeting of the Local Association on Thursday night.

Scouters Rowe and Wright proposed a joint camp for all Timmins troops and it seems probable that this will be undertaken. Dates suggested for the camp are from August 5th to August 17th, the place to be decided definitely at a later meeting. Groups wishing to send Scouts to the big Timmins camp must have their applications in by July 15th, it was decided.

It is possible that some of the Timmins Scoutmasters will attend the Gilwell camp near Brantford between July 23rd and August 3rd. This is a training camp for those in charge of Boy Scout activities and has been the means of spreading a vast amount of useful knowledge in past years. Rev. R. Manwaring, Iroquois Falls Scouter, who was in Timmins last week, is making arrangements to go and anyone in this district who would like to join him on the trip south should get in touch with him at the Falls.

While in Timmins, Scouter Manwaring expressed his delight in the rejuvenation of the Scout movement here. He said that he felt the district's largest centre should have been leading the way for many years in the number of Scouts and that it now appears to be well on the way to becoming one of the best Scouting towns.

At the local Association meeting the president, Geo. Lake, reported that the old clothes campaign had been eminently successful and that clothes had been distributed to needy settlers from Timmins to Shillington and as far north as Cochrane. The Scouts' part of the parade on May 6th and the bonfire in the evening were well carried through, he said.

Membership cards in the local Association have been prepared and will be distributed to the group committees for sale. Three-quarters of the proceeds will go to the Association and the other one-quarter to the funds of the group selling the cards. This is an approved method of raising the small amount of money necessary for carrying on the administrative work of the association and at the same time provides a new source of revenue for group activities. It is hoped that the members of the group committees will do their best to give those interested in any way in Scouting an opportunity to become members of the Local Association. No Scouts will be selling these memberships.

The first meeting of St. Anthony's pack of Wolf Cubs is scheduled for Wednesday evening when the 15 boys already chosen to form the nucleus of the pack will gather at the parish hall. Later on the number of Cubs will be increased. St. Anthony's group, the Fourth Timmins, now has troops A and B in addition to the cubs.

Central School's group will probably be organized in the fall, it was reported on Saturday.

Special gifts are making his parishioners' pride and esteem, full details of which will be given in Thursday's issue. The Archdeacon was born in Moinmouthshire, England, sixty-three years ago. Educated in private schools near Chepstow, and in London at Hampstead, he attended the London College of Divinity, and was ordained in 1895, by the Bishop of London, (Bishop Temple, father of the present Archbishop of York). His first cure of souls was in the parish of Darlaston, diocese of Lichfield. From Darlaston he went to St. George's, Battersea, where he worked for two years. From there he accepted a curacy at St. Matthew's, Luton, and after four years' ministry came to Canada to do Indian mission work. At Rupert House, St. James Bay, he worked for twelve years and for the past twenty years has been first at Porquiss Jet, and now here in South Porcupine. We add our congratulations to those of many others, and wish the Archdeacon many more years of life and success.
