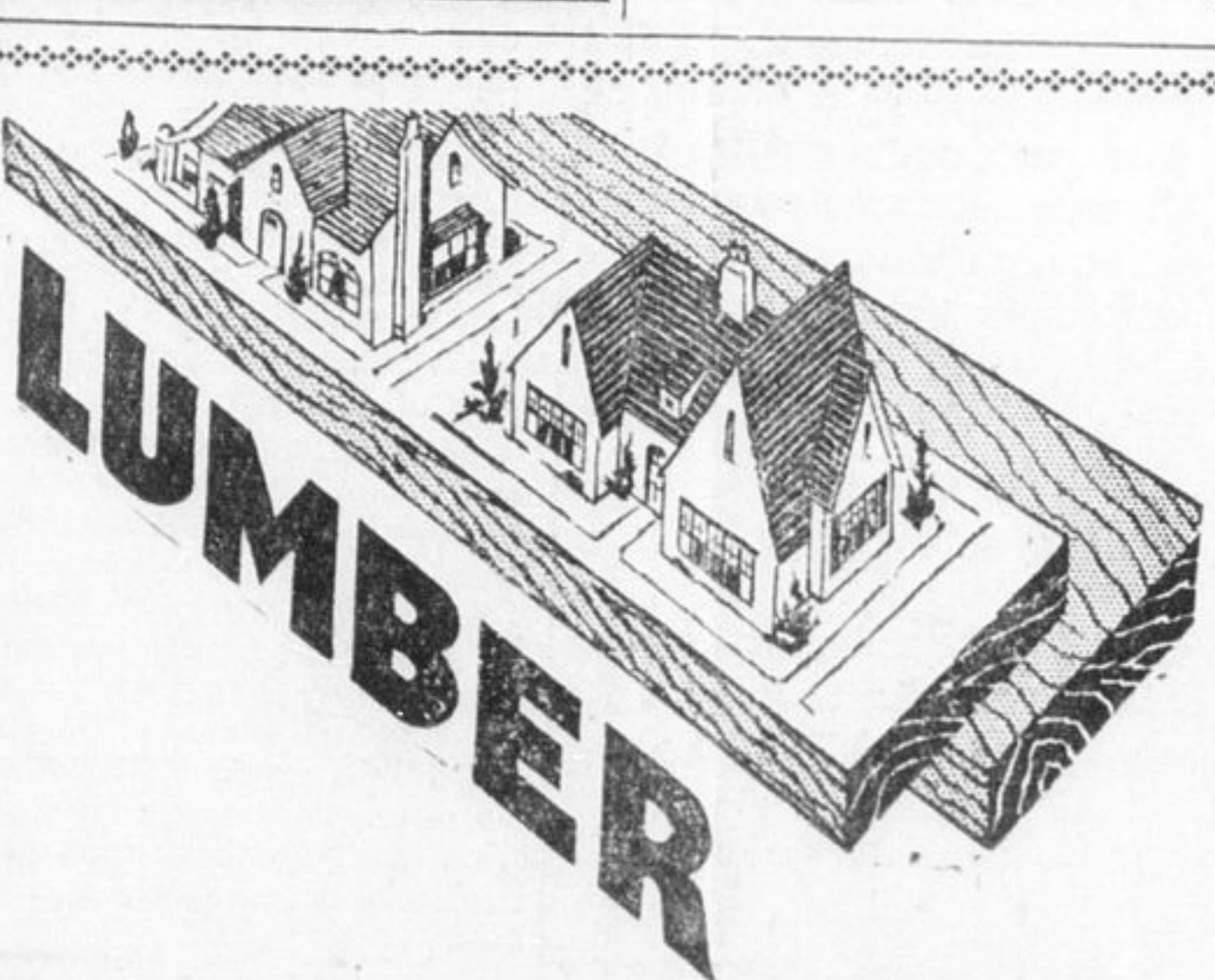

May Sets Record in the Output of Gold

Porcupine Camp Again the Leader. Total Production in Ontario, \$6,300,192 for Month.

Gold mines of Ontario made a new high monthly production record for the year in May with output of 183,124 ounces of gold and 27,383 ounces of silver, valued at \$6,300,192. For the month immediately preceding production totalled 182,965 ounces of gold and 26,162 ounces of silver, valued at \$5,886,113, while for May, 1934, production was valued at \$6,454,614.

In the month under review the Porcupine camp maintained its position as the leading gold-producing area of the province with output valued at \$2,895,836, up from \$2,547,893 in April and compares with \$2,776,460 in April and compares with \$2,540,040 in the previous month. Northwestern Ontario contributed \$509,948 against \$388,620 in April, while output by Matachewan mines amounted to \$126,948 against \$111,569 in the preceding month.

Tonnage Up

During May 578,277 tons of ore were milled, against 558,922 tons in April and 529,020 tons in May, 1934.

Thursday with a turnover unprecedented in the history of this province. The smashing victory of 45 Liberals, including their leader, A. A. Dysart, left the Conservative party with only five seats in the next House.

Premier L. P. D. Tilley and every member of his cabinet met defeat. From a total of 14 at dissolution, membership of the former opposition has been increased by 29.

The handful of Conservatives who will face more than two score Liberals across the legislature floor are: Hon. F. C. Squires, Speaker of the last House; G. W. Perry, and E. W. Melville, elected in Carleton; and Robert McAllister and A. C. Smith, elected in St. John County.

Defeated government members are: Hon. L. P. D. Tilley, premier and minister of lands and mines; Hon. W. H. Harrison, attorney-general; Hon. Lewis Smith, minister of agriculture; Hon. G. H. H. Cockburn, president of the executive council; Hon. H. I. Taylor, minister of health and labour; Hon. D. A. Stewart, minister of public works; Hon. A. J. Leger, provincial secretary-treasurer, and Hon. E. A. Reilly, chairman of the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission and minister without portfolio.

Leading a campaign for the first time, Mr. Dysart polled the largest vote in Kent. Mr. Tilley, contesting his old constituency of Saint John City for the first time as premier, and the attorney-general went down in the same riding.

The Liberal sweep was so complete that nine Conservative candidates lost their deposits in Gloucester, Kent and Madawaska. Two Independents in the latter constituency, the only one where straight Liberal-Conservative fights did not prevail, also met the same fate.
