

# R. J. Ennis New President of Mining Association

## Annual Meeting of Ontario Mining Association Held at Sudbury. Accident Prevention and Silicosis Discussed. John Knox, Second Vice-President.

A despatch last week from Sudbury gives the following account of the annual meeting of the Ontario Mining Association held at Sudbury:—

"R. J. Ennis, general manager of McIntyre Porcupine Mines Limited, Schumacher, is president for the ensuing year of the Ontario Mining Association. He was elected to that position Wednesday afternoon at a meeting of the directors of the association held in the Nickel Range Hotel. Donald MacAskill, general manager of the International Nickel Company Limited, is the immediate past president.

"M. W. Summerhayes, general manager of Wright-Hargreaves Mines Limited, Kirkland Lake, succeeds to the first vice-presidency, and John Knox, general manager of Hollinger Consolidated Gold Mines Limited, is second vice-president. The new executive committee comprises J. P. Bickell, J. Y. Murdoch, F. D. Reid, J. C. Nicholls and M. W. Summerhayes. G. C. Bateman is secretary.

About 50 members of the association from all sections of the province gathered at Sudbury on Wednesday morning for the annual meeting. This is the fourth occasion on which the organization has held its annual meetings in Sudbury since its foundation in 1920.

Prominent men in the industry were present, and notable visitors included Hon. Paul Leduc, Ontario minister of mines, and Dr. Charles Camself, deputy minister, department of mines, Ottawa.

"Wednesday morning was taken up with business meetings of the association, and discussion of matters vital to the industry, followed by election

of directors and officers for the coming year. President Donald MacAskill presided.

"Class 5 Accident Prevention Association, with Dr. C. H. Hair, of Toronto, also met Wednesday morning. The branch is operated by the Mining Association and directs its attention to the minimizing of mine accidents, also to research work and control of silicosis. Great strides have been made by the association through the instrumentality of the accident prevention branch, an integral part in the operation of mining throughout the province.

"At 2 o'clock the party was taken to the plant of the Ontario Refining Company Limited, at Copper Cliff, where operations were inspected. Wednesday evening the annual banquet at the Nickel Range hotel was held, the principal speakers being Hon. Paul Leduc, John Knox, and others.

"With the business of the association completed, there was more sightseeing on Thursday. In the morning the visitors were taken underground at the Frood mine, and had luncheon at the Copper Cliff Club.

In the afternoon the delegates were shown the reduction plants of International Nickel, the enlarged smelter and the concentrator.

## Daring Diver with Shows This Week

There's one diver who'll be down at the Mattagami this week the swimmers of Timmins won't play "follow the leader" with. That's Duncan Fairlie who dives more than a hundred feet into a flaming tank. Not only that, but Fairlie is atre himself while making the leap.

It's all part of Wallace's shows that will be set up in front of the Riverside pavilion most of this week. Fairlie is no amateur at the job and though he's a Northern Ontario boy whose first dive was from a moving train into Lake Eva on the Sioux Lookout-Port Arthur run, he's been in the game for many years now.

He has only one leg, but the accident that deprived him of the other didn't occur when he was diving. The loss of one eye did, though, when a small chip on the surface of the little tank into which he plunges, cut through the eye-lid.

He's had other accidents too. Once at the Canadian National Exhibition, he came down on his stomach and was badly bruised. Another time at Swastika, he poured three gallons of gasoline on top of the water instead of one. That did give him a hot time for awhile, but he escaped with singed hair and eyebrows.

Nintey feet, says he, is about the limit of safety for high diving, yet does more almost every day himself. The hardest part, he'll admit, is when about to strike the water. Then he grasps his right wrist with his left hand. As soon as his head is under water, he turns it, and comes shooting to the surface.
